# Take 2 with PAUL POWER Over the last few years I've been able to pick up some

Over the last few years I've been able to pick up some great books about music at Atomic Records & Collectibles. and this latest find was a treasure; "Sex, Drums, Rock and Roll! The Hardest Hitting Man in Show Business" by Kenny Aronoff is Kenny's autobiography. Most of you are probably thinking "who the heck is he?", and after reading this book I think he'd laugh at that all too familiar question. Basically Kenny Aronoff is the drummer that you've heard a million times on some of the biggest hit songs on radio; hits by John Mellencamp, John Fogerty, Belinda Carlisle, Melissa Etheridge, Bon Jovi, Rod Stewart, Meatloaf, Pumpkins, Smashing Chickenfoot, Vince Gill, Bruno Mars, Bruce Springsteen, Mick Jagger, Avril Lavigne, Celine Dion and dozens of others; the running joke in the music business is that his real name is "Can He Earn enough". Not only did he play on the recordings but in a number of Kenny bandmember for extended periods and tours, for example he spent 17 years with Mellencamp. By his own admission Kenny is a hyperactive workaholic, and a perfectionist; he's the guy they call in to hit the skins hard and do his magic on a track. As a wanna-be drummer way back in the day I really got into



Kenny's details of certain things he would do different on songs, and sure enough after reading this book I checked out the songs in question and heard things I never noticed before. Even though his versatility behind the kit is almost beyond measuring there is a signature Kenny Aronoff drum sound that no one can touch, and you can check that out; Mellencamp's "Crumbling Down", "Jack & Diane" and "Paper In Fire" are perfect examples.

My 2 biggest takeaways from this book are 1)-how someone I've heard for decades could be unknown to me until a book opens up to reveal their story and 2)-how much of a hotheaded John Mellencamp is. Although Kenny never really insults John in this book, what he does do is lav out the facts on how John treated his band and lets the reader decide. Kenny actually thanks John for the fantastic opportunity he gave him, and compliments John's drive for perfection in his music. Sorry though, my take is that Mellencamp is a jerk-but at least his music is great, no small thanks to Kenny Aronoff.

## **Tis The Season - Let The Anxiety Begin With Kiddies**

We are still looking for volunteers by the way! 902 794 9371, leave a message....

These past 13 years we have have been privileged to observe consistent, and emerging, trends with children that come through our doors. Usually in September we re - open after closing for two weeks during back to school activities.... kids are excited to get back to school, some get to show off their new, or new to them, clothes and electronics. For Clifford Street youth centre it is the beginning of a slow gradual increase of measurable anxiety in children. Our summer generally has fewer children but this starts to rebuild as September comes along. By the first week of October allot of our annual regulars, and some new ones, are back at the office.

Everyone starts to get excited about the approaching Halloween festivities held in schools, at home and in the community. [and heavily advertised] We have had some blow out haunted houses, big parties and other years we had a fairly low key celebration. We had a couple who were our big Halloween fan and they went all out...We had has some students attend to create a haunted house as well and of course we give out treats, tooth brushes and so forth... I have no idea what Halloween will look like in CBRM / schools this year...BUT this is the start of an annual, and disheartening, trend for us at Clifford Street. Once Halloween has passed the children start to focus on Christmas... everyone is on their best behavior but the stress and anxiety ratchets up and up every week ~ it is really noticeable and has happened every year since we opened. WHY?

The short version is that for a large number of children there is no Christmas gift at home... sad but true, which creates a palpable level of anxiety in the affected children which only increases the closer we get to Christmas. At Christmas the children's stress level is through the roof, most are cranky, easily upset and lash out at each other as the all too real prospect of no, or very little, Christmas presents at home overwhelms them. These thoughts are usually a remembrance of their last years Christmas... and the fear of the unknown for this year. Couple this with the cold weather and the desperate need for winter coat, boots, mitts and so on ... the cold weather actually reinforces the anxiety, no money for winter clothes, what is Christmas going to be like they think.., and again each week if notches up a bit. [ even worse? Winter coat / boots for my gifts :

Clifford Street has celebrated Christmas from day one as we, and some truly amazing benefactors, realize that what they receive from the centre very well be all they receive. [ some moms would stick the centre's gifts under their tree at Christmas / sadly some would attempt to return or sell the gifts ... imagine that heart broken child..] But we prevail and have learned... we throw away packaging, install batteries in everything, use a black marker to write the child's name on their gifts etc... so they cannot be returned. Sadder still is that the family may really need that money for essentials.... We load up the kids with extra food during the winter as well. It will be interesting to see

what new programs the schools are going to offer on top of breakfast programs... it is expensive as all the food/utensils/milk etc has to be individual portions because of covid... it is going to be a rough year all around!

We used to go to the Northside Guest home for one of our Christmas parties... the amazing staff their would invite the children and shop from our kiddies "wish list", Santa would appear, seniors, and staff, would be present and whole lot of food would be there too... thank you covid... that will not be possible this year... the kids love getting out, and especially love time with seniors. We also would hold a "golden ticket" party for selected children as well...we oftentimes held three different parties to accommodate the number of children we had... but the golden ticket party, by invitation only, was for the children that were our consistent regulars, had specific needs to be met, and whose presents our benefactors provided. From cell phones, game systems, fiddles, toys, games, art supplies, you name it and we likely gave it away thanks to those benefactors. This year will be a challenge for sure. And what about Shop of the Class where students were selected at each school, taken to the Mayflower Mall then escorted by a personal CBR Police officer along with anywhere from 100 to 300 dollars [that is another story in itself... selfless children] to spend as they see fit.

SO, what was this article all about? Anxiety in children which we have observed first hand for over a decade. It started with food security issues, hungry kids, and escalated in to all aspects of daily life particularly in our social media driven "perfect" world...so much to compare your life to. Anxiety has been a past issue, now we have a ton of covid concerns to further complicate things...Anxiety is one of the most prevalent childhood issues currently....

Did I mention we are seeking volunteers lol? A couple of volunteers/ summer students have written up something for next week... so til then relax, take it easy on each other, patience matters, wear a mask and be kind to the kiddies... their stress level is way up after returning to school /six months away...

#### **Heavy Garbage Collection Set For Sept. 28**

CBRM's municipal-wide residential heavy garbage collection starts on Monday, September 28, 2020. Residents living at properties eligible for curbside collection must have their large, heavy or bulky household items placed to the curb no later than 6:00 a.m. on Monday, September 28.

Residents are encouraged to read the details online at CBRM's website.

#### Some of the information includes:

Sofas, chairs, upholstered furniture, mattresses, box springs, carpeting, flooring, vinyl windows and doors will be collected. Panes of glass from windows should be removed when possible. Collectors are not responsible for removing broken glass and debris from your curb.

Carpeting should be rolled and tied with string or rope. Objects must be safe to handle with no protruding nails, staples or other sharps.

Wooden items must be disassembled. Wooden legs on tables should be removed. Dresser drawers should be removed, emptied and placed next to dresser. Do not place items inside drawers.

Large appliances including refrigerators, stoves, deep freezers, dishwashers, microwave ovens or humidifiers and other metal items such as empty oil tanks, empty hot water tanks, steel bath tubs, sinks and metal household radiators will be collected.

A maximum of 5 large appliances will be collected curbside from a civic address. Appliances containing Freon will be collected separately. It is recommended doors on a refrigerator and/or a deep freezer be removed and placed next to the refrigerator and/or deep freezer. Empty oil tanks 1140 L (250 gallons) or less in size and empty hot water tanks will be collected. Please make sure no liquid or residue remains inside these tanks.

Televisions, computers, microwave ovens, and other electronics included in the Electronics Recycling Program will not be collected. Old or unwanted electronics can be taken free of charge to any EPRA Drop-Off Centre for disposal.
