## Take 2 with PAUL POWER

In 1999 Metallica took a bold step and joined forces with the San Francisco Symphony to record and release a double live CD and video performance of some of the band's best songs to date, with an orchestral take on things. The project was successful, but to be honest some fans were less than impressed. Flash forward 21 years later and we have the new release of "S&M2" (actually recorded in September of 2019) which is definitely a worthy successor to "S&M". I picked up my copy of the double CD/ DVD set as soon as it was available at Atomic Records & Collectibles (shop local!) on Record Store Day. I always laugh at the hard line some Metallica fans take, saying that the band's best albums were done before "And Justice For All", whereas I believe (and many others-including the band) believe that Metallica's best album was the self-titled "Black" album. To that end my favourite songs in this collection are on Disc 2; "Enter Sandman", "Wherever I May Roam" and "Nothing Else Matters" ring truest for me. Early Metalli-fans need not be alarmed though-"For Whom The Bell Tolls", "Master of Puppets", "The Call Of Ktulu" and "(Anesthesia) - Pulling



Teeth" are here-the collection actually has 22 tracks. The second CD in the set starts off with something unexpected; the "Sythian Suite" by Russian composer Sergei Prokofiev is an orchestral piece which is followed up with the 1927 orchestral piece "The Iron Foundry" by Russian composer Alexander Mosolov. Both pieces run a total of 14 minutes so it in no way distracts from the experience-obviously it's meant to be where the symphony shines the brightest, but they are amazing throughout, especially on the DVD, which is actually the icing on the cake-presenting the full spectacle of the orchestra, the band and the fans all in unison. The release has a number of options for fans; a 4 LP black vinyl set, a limited edition orange marble vinyl set, a 2 CD & DVD set, a 2 CD & Blu-Ray set, a 2 CD set, a Blu-Ray only or a DVD only. It's been 4 years since the band's last album was released so hopefully this will hold us over until the next one comes out. Enjoy!

## OTHER VOICES ON CLIFFORD STREET

This week Taylor MacDonald, and Robyn Knott, were kind enough to submit something on their experience at Clifford Street.. what will be your volunteer experience[s] be like?

"The woman on the ground" - Hello everyone my name is Taylor MacDonald I am 23 years old; I have a bachelor of Arts in Community studies (BACS) for Cape Breton University and a passion to help children grow into their beautiful unique selves. I would like to think of myself as the woman on the ground here at Clifford Street Youth Centre (CSYC). Ill get to what I mean by that later on but first I would like to speak on what first brought me to Clifford St., what kept me there, the impact the youth at Clifford street had on my life and how that changed my career path and how eve opening this place is to me every single day it go to work. This week is going to be a bit different from what Paul has been speaking on, I want to tell you why as I young women like has fallen in love with this amazing program, and all the youth that walk thought our doors. To jump right into this Last week when Paul talked about being a volunteer and being voluntold it really sparked my thoughts of where my story starts with CSYC because to be frank with all of you when I think back to why I started at CSYC it was because I was voluntold to do so. I was in my second year of my BACS and I had to do 100 volunteer hours for one of my courses. the way I found CSYC wasn't because I really wanted to help youth in my community or that I already know about the program, it was that being an unorganized 20 year old I was late starting and need to find a placement guickly to get by 100 hours done because I only had a month and a half left in my semester. So, I sat down at my computer opened up google and typed in "places in North Sydney to volunteer at" and a giant list come up and I think for a moment I got a little cross eyed looking at it so I narrowed my search by adding "with kids" and boom there it was Clifford Street Youth Centre I would have never thought that day that this place would mean so much to me now as it does. From there I emailed Paul and the next following week I started. When I started, I was your typical voluntolder I was there to get my hours and get out of there I didn't was to work with kids I liked them but wasn't what I wanted to do, I wanted to be an RCMP officer. all this quickly changed for me when I really started to listen to the kid's stories, interests and what stresses all these youth carried around at such a young age. I would have never thought in a million years that youth from my very own neighbourhood lived these lives. Worrying that they didn't have the latest clothes, school supplies and even down to food for lunches. So with knowing this and at the young age of 20 I decided right then and there that even thought I had nothing but my time, my attention and being a big kid at heart to give to these youth that deserve so much more that what little I had to give, I was going to do what I could for those 3 hours a day to make it the funniest 3 hours I could. With the help of the manager (Rebecca) at the time I went to work and with some amazing guidance from her. Planning, organizing things I thought would be fun But my ideas fell a little short because something that I always like to tell new volunteers, grants students etc. from this experiences is that one thing that kids don't mind telling you is when they don't like something and they best thing for all of us working with kids should do is just listen to them because youth usually have the best ideas for fun.

So, as you can tell you I have currently been at the CSYC now for 3 almost 4 years now. I started off not even wanted to be there to now not know if ill never be able to leave. I keep saying that I love this place but haven't really said why. Well its because its not just one thing the draws me to this place. It the youth and all the joy and light they bring to this place even though their lives are shadowed by darkest. CSYC is a place that is very rarely quiet but the laughter fills you heart so fast you don't mind the screams that are partnered with them. Its because there is so many learning opportunities like how to communicate in all different ways, leadership, organizing an event and my favourite skill that I've learned for being at CSYC is to be adaptive because nothing ever goes as planned and you have to learn to roll with the punch's sometimes. You never know what the day is going to bring but you are always excited to see what is in store. I am guessing by now you are all probably getting why I now call myself the woman on the ground because like all levels of organizations there are different people that do different thing Paul is the brains of the program and I think I'm the muscle I deal with all the day to day on the "ground".

So, if you can take anything away from my story with Clifford Street Youth Centre is that no matter it is the littlest things can help such as you sitting and really listening to someone's story, them talk about their bad day, play a game of catch or just colouring a picture every moment count. sometimes we have to do things that we are not always happy about and don't want to do, but these things could change your life and you are not even going to know it. In this last part I would like to thank Paul and Rebecca for always believe in me this opportunity that has changed my life and I would charge it for anything.

And Robyn, who worked with us the is summer says;

This summer I was given the opportunity to work at the Clifford Street Youth Centre as a summer student. During this time period, I have learned and adapted to the many challenges that Covid-19 has presented us with. Even though the virus has made it a more challenging work environment for many, the staff here at the youth centre have still continued to entertain the children with fun and innovative socially distanced games, and have had fun while doing so! I have really enjoyed working here at the youth centre with all the kiddos I've met during the process, it's a really rewarding place to work!

Next week we will discuss back to school, what the kids are saying, what the kids need coming into winter, and the coming of Halloween~ whatever that will look like this year. Paul Ratchford



#### **Heavy Garbage Collection Set For Sept. 28**

CBRM's municipal-wide residential heavy garbage collection starts on Monday, September 28, 2020. Residents living at properties eligible for curbside collection must have their large, heavy or bulky household items placed to the curb no later than 6:00 a.m. on Monday, September 28.

Residents are encouraged to read the details online at CBRM's website.

#### Some of the information includes:

Sofas, chairs, upholstered furniture, mattresses, box springs, carpeting, flooring, vinyl windows and doors will be collected. Panes of glass from windows should be removed when possible. Collectors are not responsible for removing broken glass and debris from your curb.

Carpeting should be rolled and tied with string or rope. Objects must be safe to handle with no protruding nails, staples or other sharps.

Wooden items must be disassembled. Wooden legs on tables should be removed. Dresser drawers should be removed, emptied and placed next to dresser. Do not place items inside drawers.

Large appliances including refrigerators, stoves, deep freezers, dishwashers, microwave ovens or humidifiers and other metal items such as empty oil tanks, empty hot water tanks, steel bath tubs, sinks and metal household radiators will be collected.

A maximum of 5 large appliances will be collected curbside from a civic address. Appliances containing Freon will be collected separately. It is recommended doors on a refrigerator and/or a deep freezer be removed and placed next to the refrigerator and/or deep freezer. Empty oil tanks 1140 L (250 gallons) or less in size and empty hot water tanks will be collected. Please make sure no liquid or residue remains inside these tanks.

Televisions, computers, microwave ovens, and other electronics included in the Electronics Recycling Program will not be collected. Old or unwanted electronics can be taken free of charge to any EPRA Drop-Off Centre for disposal.
