

Take 2 with PAUL POWER

When Glass Tiger's debut album "The Thin Red Line" was originally released in 1986 it became an important album to me for personal reasons, and was a way to mark a milestone year. The red plastic cassette version of the album was given to me as a gift-and I still it (in mint condition at that) so the news of a remastered release by Universal Music Canada on 180 gram orange and black vinyl grabbed my attention, and the record looks so cool. Lead singer Alan Frew said: "Re-mastering and reissuing "The Thin Red Line" is not only a testament to the enduring legacy of an album, it's also a testament to the enduring legacy of a band and it's fans. You are the best in the world and you share with us your love, not only of GLASS TIGER but also a love of one of the greatest decades in the history of music." The first single originally released was "Don't Forget Me (When I'm Gone)" with Bryan Adams on backup vocals, and it became a number-one hit single here in Canada, and a top 5 hit in the U.S. The band followed that up with my favourite song off the album, "Someday", which also became a top 10 hit. The title track is an amazing



song that has such a memorable music video with Scottish Highlanders marching to battle (I've read that the song is about the 93rd Scottish Highlanders stand in the Crimean war against a Russian cavalry charge at the Battle of Balaclava in 1854). "I Will Be There", "You're What I look For" (with a bilingual chorus) and "Closer To You" are all great songs, but one song in particular that really impressed me with it's uniqueness was the exotic U2 sounding "Ancient Evenings", and is actually the opening song on a live concert video broadcast by MuchMusic in 1986 that you can find on YouTube. The concert has all of the album's songs, and is a treat to watch. Last year Glass Tiger released their fifth studio album, and were on the road touring. Hopefully 'someday' soon we'll be able to catch Alan & the boys live on stage as they transport us all back to 1986 and a time when Glass Tiger roared loud & proud as one of Canada's finest.

With so many stepping down it is YOUR turn to learn about the candidates, press them on their promises, see what they have actually done. [some have done incredible things by the way]

This election is very important as we have a number of folks stepping down from their long standing roles in public service...please take the time to be certain that the next person we elect for your municipal area will actually step up and do something for the constituents. Your future enjoyment, wherever you live, depends on it.

To those that stepped up now, and in the past, to run, good luck, thank you for the brave step to become our representative for our town[s]... now just don't forget to actually get up and lead for us ALL. For those retiring thank you for your service to community and paving the way for those that follow.
