## Dem Bones - A Scary Halloween Story

My granny was told as a child that Captain Kidd, knowing the law was on his trail, traveled up the Jersey coast looking for the perfect spot to bury his stolen booty. And he found it near a grove of gnarled, wind-swept pines on Sandy Hook. One moonless dark night, the Adventure Galley slid silently into harbor at Sandy Hook. Before the wondering eyes of two hidden watchers, a crew of scurvy buccaneers armed with cutlasses and pistols had rowed boatload after boatload of heavy chests into the shore. They were accompanied by a tall, proud man with red-whiskers and a cocked hat that the watchers recognized at once as the bold leader Captain Kidd. The captain led his men away from shore, and they disappeared with them into the grove of pines. The pirates were gone along time; long enough, according to those who watched, to bury any amount of treasure. They came away before dawn and rowed back to the Adventure Galley and sailed into the last vestiges of the dark night.

By my granny's time, there was nothing left of the spot save a few stunted trees, some wind-swept grass, and on certain dark nights.

Dem Bones are the skeletal crew of Captain Kidd. According to my granny, they come sailing up in a ship made of shadows. The ship moves silently up the coast at the dark of the moon, and anchors near the shores of Sandy Hook. Two or three boats are lowered from her side, and they are filled up

with the eager forms of glowing skeletons wearing cocked hats and tattered buccaneers garb. Around their waists are belts full of pistols and long cutlasses. The biggest of Dem Bones - the one that is probably the first mate - has a skeletal parrot perched on his shoulder.

Dem Bones carry heavy trunks full of treasure onto the shore and scatter them all around the place where the pine grove once stood. Then the pirate crew hauls out kegs and kegs of whiskey and one of the skeleton's takes out a fiddle. A phantom fire is lit on the sand, and Dem Bones start such a rowdy singing and dancing that the noise would wake the dead - if they weren't already awake. When they are exhausted from the dancing, the glowing skeletons collapse on the sand and start telling stories about the ships they have captured and the treasure they have amassed.

Some of Dem Bones open the big trunks and take out jewels and ropes of pearls and adorn themselves. Others toss gold coins back and forth as if they were a child's ball. At the darkest part of the night, just before dawn, Dem Bones pack up the trunks and row back to the ship of shadows. One by one, the glowing skeletons disappeared into the hold and the ship draws anchor and sails away.

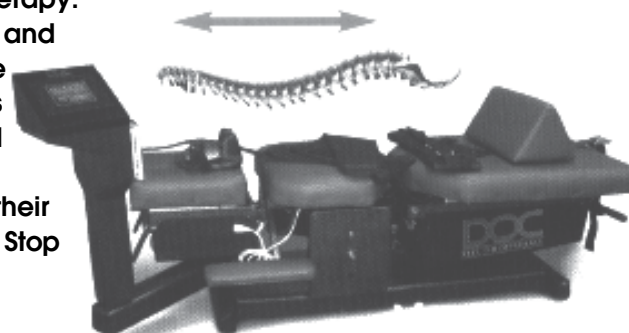

**HALLOWEEN COVID PRECAUTIONS**

Currently, there is no evidence to suggest that handling food or eating is associated with directly spreading COVID-19. It is possible that a person can get COVID-19 by touching a surface or object, including food, food packaging, or utensils that have the virus on it and then touching their own mouth, nose, or possibly their eyes. However, this is not thought to be the main way that the virus is spread. Remember, it is always important to follow good hygiene to reduce the risk of illness from common foodborne germs.

Make sure everyone washes their hands with soap and water for 20 seconds before and after preparing, serving, and eating food. Use hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol if soap and water are not available.

Instead of potluck-style gatherings, encourage guests to bring food and drinks for themselves and for members of their own household only.

Limit people going in and out of the areas where food is being prepared or handled, such as in the kitchen or around the grill, if possible.

Wear a mask while preparing or serving food to others who don't live in your household.

If serving any food, consider having one person serve all the food so that multiple people are not handling the serving utensils.

Use single-use options or identify one person to serve sharable items, like salad dressings, food containers, plates and utensils, and condiments.

Avoid any self-serve food or drink options, such as buffets or buffet-style potlucks, salad bars, and condiment or drink stations. Use grab-and-go meal options, if available.

If you choose to use any items that are reusable (e.g., seating covers, tablecloths, linen napkins), wash and disinfect them after the event.

It's been 4 years since I've written anything about Bon Jovi because it's been 4 years since their last album was released; the global pandemic not only delayed this album's release (like many others) it influenced some of the material on it as well. However, the first single "Unbroken" was released last November (there's a powerful music video on YouTube) and the song is a heartfelt anthem that shines a spotlight on the countless veterans that are living with post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD)-with all of the proceeds going to the Patriotic Service Dog Foundation. The second single, "Limitless" sizzles with that trademark Bon Jovi sound we're so familiar with as John and the boys send out positive vibes about our human potential. That 'music with a message' trend hits hard with the song "American Reckoning"- a number that John wrote while in quarantine; it deals with George Floyd's death, and the state of America as a result. Another song inspired by the pandemic is "Do What You Can", with another great music video on YouTube that's dead on the mark visually and lyrically-encouraging us all to



be better people. A Bon Jovi album wouldn't be complete without some rockin' numbers-and they're here; "Beautiful Drug" and "Brothers In Arms" are par for the course; also what Bon Jovi album would be complete without ballads-and "Story Of Love" and "Blood In The Water" fill that bill perfectly. An interesting visual clue to the heaviness or important messages that went into the music on this album is the black & white cover that has Jon Bon Jovi looking like he's about to speak (or covering his mouth) and the reflection in his sunglasses shows the American flag-with stars in the zeros of the album's title ("2020"). John Bon Jovi (real name-John Francis Bongiovi Jr.) is 58 years old and his voice is getting older too, you can hear that on this album but the way I see it is that he seems to be the genuine article, a truly nice guy in a business that's full of shallow, egotistical and self-centered celebrities-so it's nice to see and hear from someone like him and his band. This is a good album with a great message.

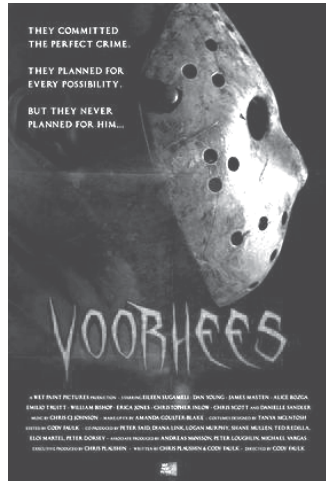

# Acquisition of Play Interests... start as early as 18 months... HUH?

We are often asked "what is it that you do at Clifford Street Youth Centre?" ... which, if boiled down to its basic elements, is that we "provide experiential exposure opportunities" [ that's the government words we use in reports or grants ] which means we expose our childrens minds to what is, what could be, what should be and/or better still what if? [ more government words like "pivot expectations" lol ] WE look to give children a chance to see what is out there, expose their developing minds to new and differing things. We have done this since opening over thirteen years ago. Because young children have no buying power they are dependent on their parent/guardian to provide them with these educational exposures... so parents let kids try new things... but what if poverty exists in the household? Does this limit the childs experiences or future chances? Case in Point; A large number of children get car sick easily primarily due to lack of drives in a car from early ages...[ some get sick as we leave North Sydney ~ we have permission slips for them to have a motion sickness pill prior to heading out ]... so many kids are is awe when we drive them to Sydney... even young teens... many have never been to the Mayflower Mall, some still not even to the Northside Mall! SO, Clifford Street tries to identify these areas where children require exposure, seemingly mainstream and occasionally uncommon, as much as possible ~ sometimes grant dependent, and repeatedly. The hard part for us is to keep the 'awe' of new things for kiddies... then new kids come along and we start all over again.

We are advocates of free play, but **what is play?** According to Joyce Alexander of Texas A & M [ Dean of Human Development ]

**Procedural Play** is structured around rules and leads to interest in sports and games. **Conceptual Play** is organized around gathering of facts, information and objects. **Creative Play** is founded in exploration, think via building blocks or art supplies [ crafting/creating ]. **Dramatic Play** comes in the form of role playing, 'I am the star', with toys etc as props ~ think of karaoke for kiddies which is very popular.... Apparently cognitive and dramatic play leads children to have stronger cognitive skills than those favouring the other groups....

We focus on experience exposure as much as possible, conceptual play, and we make sure the children use dramatic play, even as simply as "being the kitchen helper/boss" for the day. [ in charge of yard clean up/ room clean up as examples ] Interestingly, regardless of even young ages at times, one of the most favoured 3-D games, where you wear the 3 D glasses, is the game of 'work' where the player acts out in a virtual game of work... it is by far the most popular 3 D game... the children talk at length about it... role playing in the work environment. WE also explain the value of work and how earning money allows them to make decisions in their life & that as they get older they can buy things for themselves, and others. Like when we took the kids on rented Sea doos/kayaks etc... they were in awe... a teachable moment on work/saving/ etc.

Even the most simple interactions are teachable moments for us. While we endeavour to keep it fresh it can be helpful to have extra funds to allow us to explore new things for the kiddies. Sometimes we can recycle, or reintroduce, games and events~Just found the pedometers, charged them up where the kids could see me, and the jockeying to get one from me / wear them and compete with each other, or against themselves, started.. just that easy. Also dug out the old cheap cameras from a grant that we had several years ago... kids are given the camera and a theme... like pretend you are Mittens the cat and take photos as she would see things at her short height... or nature, ... then free day... amazing results... we even had photo exhibits at the North Sydney library a few years back...kids see things in a different, and often interesting, way. The point there is that we use and re-use what we receive to the benefit of our new arrivals.. So if you ask what we do, we do as much as we can with what we have on hand. Every now and then we receive a grant or a donation and this allows us to expand the childrens world in a new and exciting way ~ so thank you to those that have donated~ the gift that keeps on giving!

Despite covid we are currently preparing for Halloween with the children, fresh fruit treats and the like, decorating cards for Veterans/ Remembrance Day and then Christmas which is less than eight weeks away.
