ADVICE FOR INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES

Reducing contact with other people

Nova Scotians should not leave the province and only leave home for essential items and services. If possible, one person per family should be designated to do these tasks.

Nova Scotians are required to practice social distancing to help reduce the spread of COVID-19. Social distancing means limiting your contact with other people - stay about 2 metres (6 feet) apart.

Government is requiring individuals, employers and organizations to limit non-essential gatherings to no more than 5 people.

AVOID: group gatherings (ex: parties, weddings, funerals, bridge clubs)

visitors in your home

sleepovers and playdates and other social interactions with

friends

public spaces (ex: malls, gyms, theatres, stores) parks

non-essential travel

TOO MANY COOKS

There's an old saying that "too many cooks spoil the broth." I guess those old sayings come from practical experience. I remember one year when we all lived at home. Christmas was "just around the corner" as the saying goes. We had a family of 8 and we were all ready to celebrate our Christmas in our own way.

We always had a little family get together about a week before Christmas as we were all busy on Christmas day and Boxing day with our own families. One of the highlights was our "Christmas Buffet". Everyone would bring a munchie type food and a baked item. With eight people and our mother, we had a varied supply of dishes. Chili, chicken wings, honey garlic ribs, stuffed chicken breasts, rabbit pie and pizza were always on the menu.

We also had the punch pot down in the basement on its own table. Dad would make his favorite fruit punch and he would then "flavor" it with some fancy liquor he would buy at the liquor store. There were five boys in the family and three girls. The boys would also sneak some of their own favorite brew in the pot (actually it was a huge stainless steel lobster pot) to "flavor" it as well.

The boys were all downstairs watching the hockey game and cheering on the Leafs while two of the brothers were rooting for the Canadiens. We sent a punch bowl filled with the brew upstairs for the girls to drink. After the second period ended and many rounds of punch were drunk, dad got up to go to the bathroom and fell "arse over tea kettle" as he got up from the couch. All the boys thought this was hilarious and when Dougie went to get up, he too took a header. This prompted another round of laughter.

By now, nobody was feeling any pain and the boys nearly wet themselves when they saw Dad actually crawling up the basement steps to get upstairs. To put it mildly, he was "pie eyed." The girls were in rare form as well. Mom was telling dirty jokes, a rare thing for her to do, and the girls all had tears running down their faces.

When the time came to go home, everybody realized that they would need to call taxies to get home. It was like a convention as a parade of eight taxies lined up outside our door. The next day we all understood what had happened and solved the mystery. After Dad talked to the boys, they all admitted to "flavoring" the punch with a 26 ouncer each, unaware that each of the five boys had done this. The brew must have been pretty near 100% alcohol. No wonder everybody was bombed.

Everybody made it home safely and they still talk about the "Great Christmas Party" with a twinkle in their eyes.





I was searching through my CD collection (yep, old-school) and came across this 'blast from the past' from 2016 -"**Magnolia**". Megan Bonnell is a Toronto singer/songwriter who released her first album in 2013. That debut generated a lot of industry buzz,

and as a result Megan did support gigs throughout North America and Europe; during that time on the road she laid the foundation for this album by writing some of the songs.

With everything happening all around her Megan said she wanted to move forward, yet still keep the past as relevant as she could-honouring the moments that resonated with her, the good ones and the bad ones. All that led to "Magnolia". It starts off with the song "Can't Have You", which has a soft and gentle folk sound; Megan said it's like a handwritten love letter about a love that can't last. Similarly, "Out And Away" and "Broken Hearted Avenue" are like dandelions, so delicate that a light breeze of wind could pick them up and carry them away, yet Megan's voice has the power to hold them firmly in place. "You Are The

One" is one of the most powerful tracks here, clearly allowing Megan the sonic space to express so much through the lyrics, and her voice-as the instruments act as a musical ebb and flow. Megan's rockier side shines through on the track "Golden Boy", which reminds me of a song the Cowboy Junkies or Lana Del Ray might do. "The Wind" has a great piano vibe that carries the song along in

a fanciful fashion and Megan sounds a tiny bit like Bjork (when Bjork sings normal that is) on the number, and "Dynamite" comes across like a Nina Simone-influenced song, with a building intensity

that has just enough quirkiness to keep it superinteresting. I was familiar with Megan's "Maps" EP (2011) and her debut album "Hunt And Chase" (2013), which were both very good releases. Megan said that a lot of things happened in the 5 years between "Maps" and this album-and it shows, as Megan has written/co-written great songs, and recorded what is definitely her best work up to 2016. So what words best describe the songs on this album? Delicate. intense, smoky, quirky, gentle, intriguing, soft, magnetic, captivating, but most of all, a great listen.


Hello everybody Jack Cool here and this is K-LEE Radio DJ news for this week

TAX TIPS COLUMN

Changes to benefits, credits, deductions, and programs

Canada Pension Plan (CPP) enhancement – Employed individuals should report their base CPP/Quebec Pension Plan (QPP) contributions on T4 earnings as a non-refundable tax credit at line 30800 of the income tax return. For 2019 and subsequent tax years, the new deduction for the enhanced CPP contributions on T4 earnings will be allowed at new line 22215 on the income tax return.

Self-employed individuals should report half of the base amount of their CPP/QPP contributions on self-employed income at line 31000 (formerly line 310 for 2018 and prior tax years) as a nonrefundable tax credit. The other half of the base amount and the full amount of the enhanced CPP contributions on self-employed earnings will be allowed as a deduction at existing line 22200.

Canada training credit limit – Eligible workers of at least 25 years old and less than 65 years old at the end of 2019 and later years, and who meet certain conditions will accumulate \$250 a year, up to a lifetime limit of \$5,000 to be used in calculating their Canada Training Credit, a new refundable tax credit available for 2020 and future years.

Based on the information on their return, the CRA will determine their Canada training credit limit for the 2020 tax year and provide it to them on their notice of assessment for 2019 and will be available in My Account.

For 2020 and future years, an individual may be able to claim a Canada Training Credit equal to their Canada Training Credit Limit for the year or 50% of their eligible tuition and fees paid to an educational Institution in Canada, whichever is less.

Canada workers benefit – The Canada workers benefit, formerly the working income tax benefit, is a refundable tax credit available to eligible individuals and families who work, but earn low income. As of February 2020, a simplified version of the advance payments application will be available in My Account.

Withdrawals have increased under the Home Buyers' Plan – The maximum amount that can be withdrawn from a registered retirement savings plan under the Home Buyers' Plan increased from \$25,000 to \$35,000, for withdrawals made after March 19, 2019.
