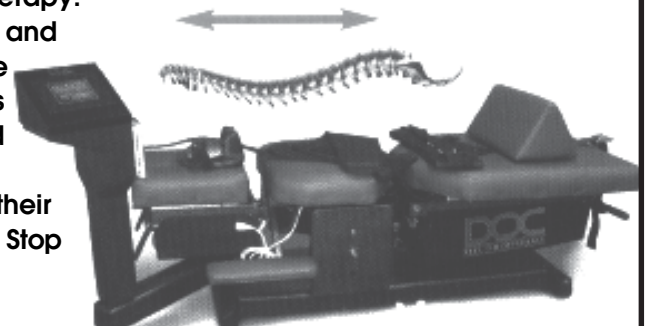

TAKE A SHINE TO

Cape Breton has a grand tradition of brewing drink and I'm not speaking about tea here. The Scots and Irish ancestors brought over their talents and skills of brewing and it has been carried on in every nook and cranny since that time.

Things were fine until the government decided to legislate the brewing of liquor and beer and it went underground. The government agents have spent time, money and effort in trying to uncover hidden stills. The locals have invented many plans and schemes to avoid being caught.

Some of the stories make amusing tales. In the early days of our island history, the stills were hidden in caves and distant places. Look-outs were posted and many traps were set to prevent discovery. As time went on, the stills were located close by hidden in plain site.

One such example was a cow barn that had the still and copper pipes running together with the milking machines and to the casual observer, they looked like any dairy operation.

Another ingenious still was uncovered in a restaurant that catered to the working man and the still was set up in plain site but looked just like a part of the kitchen equipment so any steam or heat was easily explained.

Once the "moonshine" was distilled, it had to be delivered. The drivers of the day were as experienced as any NASCAR driver would be today. I remember several of my kinfolk telling stories of being chased by government officials and the driver would turn up a particular road and there were traps set up like spiked rods and mud holes. The driver would know exactly where they were but the unsuspecting government drivers would run into these obstacles and blow out the tires on the cars or get stuck in a ditch.

The entire neighbourhood were generally aware of the locals and what they were up to. If any stranger or suspicious character showed up or hung around, they knew instantly and the village grapevine would report it. This story involves an actual case in the Inverness area. A stranger showed up in town and the "shiners" were tipped off.

They allowed the government agent to follow them to a farmhouse and in plain sight started loading gallon jugs in the back of the car. When they left the farmhouse, the government car followed close behind. To make it look authentic, the "shiners" began to speed and soon the chase was on. They roared through town and finally the car was stopped at a roadblock and the driver arrested. The "shine" was confiscated and the date set for the trial.

When the trial came, the defendant didn't even have a lawyer. The government official outlined his case, claiming he observed the transfer of the illegal booze and had it locked in the vault ever since. He took several jars to court to show as evidence. When he was finished testifying, it looked bad for the driver, Archie Neil Beaton.

Archie got up and said to the judge, "Your honor, I was coming home from my cousin's place when this big black car came right up behind me. I speeded up and he kept coming. I got frightened and took off. That's when I came to the roadblock."

He then went over to the government desk, asked the clerk for a glass and poured a little of the liquid into the cup. He turned back to the judge and said, "Your honor, I am confident that you can tell good shine when you taste it." He handed the judge the glass and the judge took a little sip to wet his lips. He then downed the half glass as the court spectators gasped.

The judge turned to the government bench and said, "Gentlemen, this is nothing but pure water. You better come up with better evidence than this or your case will be gone like shit through a goose!"

The startled government "boys" opened the remaining jars only to discover there was water in all of them. Archie Neil knew he was being watched so he had filled the jugs with well water and the real shine was delivered after the government car started following Archie. They had been babysitting 20 gallons of well water for a month.



Sometimes a good horror film is just the release to take our minds off the real-life horror around us: 2012's **"The Raven"** is one of my favourite movies, starring John Cusack, Luke Evans, Brendan Gleeson and Alice Eve. The movie documents the last few weeks of Edgar Allen Poe's life. I say "documents" but

s p e c u l a t e s might be a better word to use here.

On October 3, 1849, Poe was found in a delirious state on the streets of Baltimore, "in great distress, and... in need of immediate assistance" as was reported by Joseph Walker-the man who found him. It was also said that Poe repeatedly called out the name "Reynolds" on the night before his death, and at the time it was not clear as to whom he was referring to, and that is where this movie presents a scenario, an explanation if you will as to what that meant, and the horrifically sinister nature of that name. Some sources say that Poe's final words were "Lord help my poor soul", and in a bizarre and fitting twist all of Poe's



medical records were lost, including his death certificate. The movie is considered fiction, but the writers capitalized on some real accounts of Poe's mysterious death. I don't want to give too much away but I will say that the movie walks a great line between a Gothic horror tale (set in the 1800's) and a more modern, slightly graphic horror movie; let's just say that some of Poe's greatest nightmarish tales play a large part in what unfolds as Edgar Allen Poe is forced to face his

literary monsters in a form. When the movie came out it didn't get overly-supportive reviews, and at the box office it made \$29 million worldwide on a budget of \$26 million (which obviously

doesn't include DVD and Blu-ray sales). However, in my opinion the acting is fantastic, especially the villains, the visuals are stunning and the story line is very evocative of a Gothic mindset. I am a huge fan of John Cusack's acting, having followed his work since the 1980's, and this movie was directed by James McTeigue, who also directed another fav movie of mine-"V for Vendetta". This is not a movie to be missed-it's spine-tingling with a hint of the historically plausible, and that makes it even scarier.

TAX TIPS COLUMN

CANADA TRAINING CREDIT LIMIT – Eligible workers of at least 25 years old and less than 65 years old at the end of 2019 and later years, and who meet certain conditions will accumulate \$250 a year, up to a lifetime limit of \$5,000 to be used in calculating their Canada Training Credit, a new refundable tax credit available for 2020 and future years.

Based on the information on their return, the CRA will determine their Canada training credit limit for the 2020 tax year and provide it to them on their notice of assessment for 2019 and will be available in My Account.

For 2020 and future years, an individual may be able to claim a Canada Training Credit equal to their Canada Training Credit Limit for the year or 50% of their eligible tuition and fees paid to an educational institution in Canada, whichever is less.

CANADA WORKERS BENEFIT – The Canada workers benefit, formerly the working income tax benefit, is a refundable tax credit available to eligible individuals and families who work, but earn low income. As of February 2020, a simplified version of the advance payments application will be available in My Account.

CLIMATE ACTION INCENTIVE PAYMENT – The federal fuel charge will no longer apply in New Brunswick as of April 2020. This means that residents of New Brunswick will no longer receive climate action incentive payments.

Eligible individuals who are residents of Alberta may now claim the climate action incentive payment. The climate action incentive payment may still be claimed by eligible individuals who are residents of Saskatchewan, Manitoba, or Ontario.

A 10% supplement is available to eligible individuals in these provinces who are residents of small or rural communities. The climate action incentive payment is first used to reduce any balance owing, and then it may create or increase a refund.

CANADA PENSION PLAN (CPP) ENHANCEMENT – On January 1, 2019, Canadians began contributing more to the Canada Pension Plan. You can claim a deduction for your enhanced contributions to the CPP. Annual contribution rates will rise modestly over seven years. This change helps increase retirement income for working Canadians and their families.
