

DAVIS DAY RECOGNIZED TO HONOR **CAPE BETON COAL MINERS**

Davis Day originated in memory of William Davis, a coal miner who was killed during a long strike by the province's coal miners against the British Empire Steel Corporation.

The key events took place at Waterford Lake, near the town of New Waterford in the industrial district of Cape Breton Island. At the start of the strike in March 1925, the corporation cut off credit at the company stores, and the coal miners survived on relief payments and donations from supporters as far away as Boston and Winnipeg. After three months, the corporation planned to resume operations without a settlement. In response, at the beginning of June the coal miners reinforced the shutdown by taking control of the power plant that served the mines in the New Waterford district and also supplied water and power to the town. The shortage of water caused inconvenience and concern to citizens, but the coal miners were able to draw on local wells and set up a volunteer service to deliver water to the hospital

The situation turned critical in the early hours of June 11, when a force of company police recaptured the power plant. Hundreds of coal miners, possibly more than 2,000 in number, marched to Waterford Lake in protest. The thirty-eight-year-old William Davis was among them. The company police started shooting and fired more than 300 shots. Davis was shot and killed, either by deliberate aim or by a stray bullet, and several other miners were wounded. In the following days, company facilities, including the stores, were looted and vandalized. The Canadian army was called out to police the district. A provincial election followed later that month, and the new government arranged for a settlement of the strike and continued recognition of the union. Commemoration

In commemoration of Davis's sacrifice, the United Mine Workers of America designated the day in his honour, with miners in Nova Scotia vowing never to work on June 11.

CBRM PROPERTY TAX FINANCING HELP

Financing program begins with 6 months of \$25 payments.

Property tax bills are due on June 30 and Cape Breton Regional Municipality has a program to assist residents affected by the COVID-19 State of Emergency.

The Municipal Property Tax Financing Program is available for eligible residential and commercial property owners.

Property owners who own a residential property and have experienced a significant reduction in income due to the State of Emergency may be eligible.

Taxable commercial properties, such as shopping, office, industrial, and farm properties may also be eligible if they have experienced financial hardship through loss of revenue related to the State of Emergency.

A property that is used for tourist accommodations and is registered under the Tourist Accommodations Registration Act, such as hotels, motels, bed and breakfasts are also eligible.



For approved applications, property tax payments will be spread out over 30 months with the first six payments at \$25 per month.

The remainder of the tax bill will be divided by 24 to get the monthly amount for the rest of the term. A small amount of interest, 1.35 per cent, will be applied to the monthly payments.

The deadline for applying is June 30.

Last week I wrote about Metallica's return from the heavy metal wasteland to their status as the most important metal band with the release of "Hardwired...to Self-Destruct". For this album, it seems that Kirk Hammett (the coolest guy in the band) was the whipping boy

the whipping boy. Everything was written by James Hetfield and Lars Ulrich. Bassist Robert Trujillo said; "Lars focused more on simplifying the creative journey, and locking into

James and really bringing him in for this album, it's Lars' vision, and I'm happy to support whatever we need to do." Keep in mind that even though he's a skilled bass player, Trujillo was just a hired gun to replace Jason Newsted when Jason left Metallica in 2001. So he toes the Metallica line. Even more interesting was when Kirk Hammett said; "For me, being in this band, I always want to contribute, obviously, that was not meant to be this time and I had to accept that fact. ... Hopefully. I can bring my ideas to the next Metallica album. I just hope it's not another eight years." The first track on the

album was a welcomed return of the mighty Metallica; "Hardwired" is pure old school Thrash-the same molten metal the band threw in our faces in 1983. That rings true for "Moth Into Flame". Without a doubt track 2, "Atlas, Rise" is my favourite song of all here-it is 100% pure audio adrenaline as the band climbed to the highest peak they've been to in years. An extra bonus was the (intentional or unintentional)

guitar nod to Iron Maiden in the chorus. This song alone makes this whole release worthwhile. The song "Now That We're Dead" sounds like an early Armored Saint number-1980's

style heavy metal decked out in denim, leather and studs. There's a big surprise for the ears here on track 6; "Halo on Fire" has an almost Nirvanalike grunge sound to it and "Dream No More" sounds like a heavier version of a Soundgarden number.

There are 12 songs here and every one is a winner; the album actually closes off with the blistering-hot pure thrash metal song "Spit Out The Bone" which takes the listener back to the "Kill "Em All" days, and to a band that really has come full-circle, to their creditand to our undying love as fans of Metallica. Looking back-this was, and still is a great album.



TAX TIPS COLUMN

RRSP AS IMMEDIATE TAX RELIEF - Any Canadian who has earned income should file a tax return and start building RRSP contribution room. You can contribute 18% of your earned income from the previous year (up to yearly maximum limits), and the contribution room carries forward indefinitely. Canadians put money into RRSPs to primarily save for retirement, but the contribution also provides immediate tax relief — reducing taxable income by the amount of your contribution

You're allowed to contribute to your RRSP in the first 60 days of the calendar year and apply the deduction to your prior year's tax return. That gives smart tax planners a window to maximize their tax deductions by making an RRSP contribution during this period. A good rule is to contribute to your RRSP when your income is high – say more

DEDUCT CHILD CARE EXPENSES - Childcare has quickly become one of the largest household expenses for young families. Thankfully, the CRA allows you to claim these expenses as a tax deduction on your tax return. In most cases, childcare expenses must be claimed by the parent with the lower net income.

Basic limit for childcare expenses

Eligible children born in 2012 or later = \$8,000

Number of eligible children born in 2002 to 2011 = \$5,000

DEDUCT MOVING EXPENSES - You can deduct reasonable moving expenses if you've relocated for a new job or to attend a post-secondary program at a university, a college, or another educational institution. The home will need to be at least 40 kilometres closer to your new place of employment or school. Moving expenses may include:

Vehicle expenses, accommodations, and meals for your family Any fees incurred for changing your address on documents

The cost of utility hookups and disconnections

Title transfer costs for your new home
