

Goes Around, Comes Around

Manual Training, or Shop Class, as it would be known today, was one of the best features for young teens growing up during the 60s and 70s. It was not for the projects we did like window boxes, or end tables, but the illegal stuff we made for our own projects.

One of the things we would make is our own racing carts with parts we scrounged from several junk yards and back yards and cobbled together with nails from the Steel Plant and screw nails and bolts we "borrowed" from Manual Training. It was more like the Sea King helicopter operation where we would have 6 guys building a cart.... 1 driver, two pushers and three "mechanics".

The driver was always the smallest in weight and the pushers were bruisers capable of joining the Canadiens defence line. The mechanics were responsible for the parts and crew operations of the cart. We would race around a course we laid out in a vacant lot. Usually the wheels or the steering were first to go.

When we discovered that we were not the fastest cart, we decided to resort to other desperate tactics like smashing into the other car like a demolition derby and hope to be the last one rolling. We could never compete with Gary Fuller's car because his father worked at a hardware store and he had "factory parts" for his carts. We had to make do with junkyard gear.

Each week we would slowly make our way home with faces like the ABC Agony of Defeat promos. Instead of congratulating Gary, we would plot ways to get even.

Sometimes you tend to overthink plans. I can truthfully attest that our gang would not be considered in that group. Hawk Tracey blurted out, "Why don't we swipe a hack saw blade from the Manual Training shop and cut Gary's axle halfway through so that it will crack at the first turn and we'll win.

Then, like a light slowing dawning, Ronnie MacPhee said, "Since we will win. Why not put a \$5 bet on it?" Ronnie wouldn't be mistaken for an Einstein but this was one of his brief flashes of brilliance.

We set up the race for the weekend and Gary accepted immediately. Word went around and on Saturday morning we had quite a crowd waiting to see our ultimate disgrace in the cart racing world. On Friday night, Hawk and I snuck over to Gary's back yard and patiently cut the front axle with the hack saw blade.

So when the race started, we assumed that the axle would snap immediately but we were quite surprised when Gary took off without a hitch. We started to push but Gary was already about half a lap ahead. Our pushers were bruisers but not long winded.

We had agreed to 5 laps and by the halfway mark Gary was just about ready to lap us when Providence shone upon us and the axle snapped. We cheered and with a renewed strength pushed our cart to victory while Gary and his crew had the cart turned over and when we demanded our money, he accused us of sabotage. Naturally, we were outraged and said that Gary was a "welcher" and "a poor loser". There was nothing worse you could accuse a kid of then being a poor loser. Gary paid up but vowed to "get even" but it never happened because we couldn't beat Gary and his cart on a good day with a tailwind By the way, Gary went on to become a lawyer. Does anyone know the statute of limitations on axle cutting?

Take 2 with PAUL POWER

One year ago today John Prine passed away from Covid-19; he was 73 years old. So I wanted to look at the last album he did. 2018's "The Tree Forgiveness". John was known for writing songs that, on the surface seemed a bit silly-but had deeper and insightful meanings. He toured for over 50 years and released over 2 dozen albums: in 2017 John was named Artist of the Year by American Music Association. When an album kicks off with a song like "Knockin' On Your Screen Door" you know you're in for a great time-it's an up tempo country number dressed up in it's finest attire, with vocals that remind me of Kris Kristofferson. Being so clever and relevant John Prine's tongue-in-cheek lyrics entertained fans for decades; "Egg and Daughter Nite, Lincoln Nebraska, 1967" is one such song that is also known as "Crazy Bone"-I won't say any more about the meaning of the song, you have to hear it for yourself. As for some of the other numbers, "Summer's End" has the most powerful video I've seen in years on YouTube-and the song itself is beautiful beyond words, making it the best track here. and one of John's best songs ever. "Caravan of Fools" is like something Johnny Cash might have



done on his last albums. It was common for John to sometimes aet quirkier than his usual slant from time to time, and he stretched out "Lonesome Friends of Science", a song that should be a big hit with "The Big Bang Theory" cast and crew. John's lyrics and music on this album also had elements that made me think of Blue Rodeo-and "Boundless Love" would easily fit onto a set list by Jim Cuddy and friends. One of the best songs here is "God Only Knows" with it's 'not sure but sure it's not the best' view on actions, words and deeds. That looking skyward view finishes up the album with "When I Get To Heaven", a farewell ditty in which John wanted to smoke a cigarette nine miles long, find lost loved ones, get rid of his watch, "cause when you're deadyer a dead peckerhead" (according to his dad). This song was a great send off as John had cancer 2 times, and couldn't smoke anymore-but said he missed it every day.

GRASS FIRE SAFETY

A grass fire differs from other fires by its extensive size, the speed at which it can spread out form its original source, its potential to change direction unexpect-



edly and its ability to jump gaps such as roads, rivers and fire breaks. To prevent dangerous grass fires, assess your property to determine its risk. Tall trees, wild grass, shrubs and any other combustible materials can all contribute to spreading a fire. During drought or extended lengths of dry weather, this vegetation can become perfect fuel for a fire driven by strong winds. Some simple planning will greatly reduce the threat to your home, property and community.

- * Do not throw cigarette or cigar butts on the ground or out of a vehicle. Dispose of them properly and make sure the are completely extinguished.
- * Keep a 30 foot "safety zone" surrounding your home. This area should be clear of brush, with grass cut short. Store firewood and other combustible materials at least 30 feet away from any buildings. For homes that sit on a steep slope, the safety zone should be increased accordingly.
- * Keep your yard healthy, cut and watered it is a natural firebreak.
- *Clean up dead leaves and twigs from yard, roof and gutters. Cut tree limbs within 15 feet of the ground and remove dead branches that extend over the roof.
- * Do not park cars, trucks or recreational vehicles on dry grass or shrubs. Exhaust systems on vehicles can reach temperatures of more than 500° C. It only takes about 200° C to start a grass fire in the Summer.
- * Use an approved spark arrester on all internal combustion engine power equipment. This special muffler helps ensure that sparks generated by off road vehicles, chainsaws and other equipment don't start grass fires.
- * Parents should emphasize to their children the dangers of playing with fire. Children who have no idea how quickly flames can grow and spread, start many grass fires.
- * Homeowners who barbecque should maintain a 10 foot area free of brush and shrubbery around grills and propane tanks. Never leave a grill unattended.
- * Keep a shovel, buckets of water, fire extinguisher or garden hose on hand any time while burning outside.
- * If conducting a controlled burn, have a water hose close by and inform your local fire department before burning.

TAX TIPS COLUMN

SENIORS TAX DEDUCTIONS

Canadian senior citizens are eligible to receive a wide range of tax benefits, including a few not available to younger taxpayers.

You are allowed to claim a credit if you were 65 or older at the end of the tax year. Your net income on your tax return must also be less than the threshold of the tax year. The age amount you can claim depends on your net income reported on line 23600. The age amount is reported on line 30100 as part of your non-refundable tax credits. This means that you will receive a 15% reduction on your federal tax.

PENSION INCOME AMOUNT - "As people get older, they often stop working, meaning their income may be derived from a public pension plan, such as the Canada Pension Plan, or private pension plan," said Larson. As of publication, you may claim up to \$2,000 in credit for the pension income amount if you have eligible pension income. Eligible income may include pension or annuity income you received as payments for a pension or superannuation plan, payments you received from an RRSP, or payments from splitting your spouse/common-law pension.

"If you are married or have a common-law partner, you may shift pension income from one partner to another so the family pays lower tax," said Larson. If you earn a higher income than your spouse, your spouse may have a lower tax rate, and transferring your eligible pension income amounts to your spouse will allow a decrease in the overall tax your family pays, he said. As of publication, you can transfer up to 50 percent of your eligible pension income to your spouse or partner.

MEDICAL EXPENSES - Medical expenses are a significant cost for anyone. But as people get older, the need for medical care increases and that portion you pay adds up for medical costs. Larson said people are allowed to claim medical expenses that aren't reimbursed if they exceed 3 percent of income.

The CRA allows people to claim a wide range of medical expenses — some of them obvious and others, not so much. You may include your prescription medication costs and the amounts you pay to your doctors, for instance. You can also include more obscure medical expenses, such as air conditioning, bathroom aids and book page-turning devices. When you list your medical expenses, you must be able to account for each cost with documentation. "You must keep your receipts," Larson pointed out.
