Just when we were starting to get back to some semblance of normal, we are hit with another COVID Lockdown. This is necessary because of the spike in new infections. I would encourage everyone to get the vaccine shots to protect yourself and your family.

I have had several calls and emails asking for specific information on what is closed and what we can expect. Below is the entire list that the Provincial Government issued on Wednesday of last week. We will continue to pubish in digital format until the businesses, Legions, Fire Halls and Libraries open again.

28 APRIL 2021 - All counties need to follow province-wide restrictions and protective measures. Additional restrictions and protective measures are no longer in place for Halifax, Hants, Lunenburg and Guysborough County locations.

Avoid non-essential travel outside your community (municipality where you live). Don't travel outside your community unless it's for essential travel like work, childcare, child custody, medical and legal appointments and necessary services like food, gas, healthcare and medications. You can book a COVID-19 test or vaccine at the closest location to your home.

Gathering limit (indoors and outdoors) is no more than your household bubble (the people you live with). Smaller households with up to 2 people can socialize with 2 additional people, but they must be the same 2 people all of the time.

Faith gatherings are not permitted.

Wedding ceremonies and funerals can have up to 5 people plus the person conducting the ceremony (receptions and visitation are not permitted).

Gathering limit with social distancing for mental health and addictions support groups - 10 people maximum.

Public schools, pre-primary and private schools are closed.

Meetings and training (indoor and outdoor) hosted by a business or organization are not permitted, including:

provincial and municipal governments private businesses and organizations

first responder organizations

organized clubs



Organized performing arts and sports are not permitted. Virtual gatherings and performances are permitted with a maximum of 5 people in 1 location.

Businesses and organizations are not permitted to host events and activities (indoors or outdoors), including:

arts and culture events

festivals

social events

special events

sports (recreational, amateur and professional), recreational and physical activity events

wedding and funeral receptions and visitation

Businesses and organizations offering a wide variety of indoor recreation activities (like indoor play areas, arcades, climbing facilities, dance classes and music lessons) must close.

Indoor fitness establishments (like gyms, yoga studios and climbing facilities) and sport and recreation facilities (like pools, arenas, tennis courts and large multipurpose recreation facilities) must close.

Outdoor fitness and recreation businesses and organized clubs can operate with up to 5 people maximum and must maintain a minimum physical distance of 2 metres (6 feet) between participants during activities.

Adult day programs for persons with disabilities funded by the Department of Community Services must close.

Adult residential centres and regional rehabilitation centres licensed by the Department of Community Services are closed to visitors. Residents are not permitted to leave the facilities.

Long-term care facilities are closed to visitors, except for designated caregivers. Residents are not permitted to leave the facilities.

Regulated and unregulated health professions can remain open if they have an approved Workplace COVID-19 Prevention Plan.

Museums, libraries and Art Gallery of Nova Scotia must close. Libraries can offer pick up and drop off for books and other materials.

Personal services businesses (like hair salons, barber shops, spas, nail salons and body art establishments) must close.

Casino Nova Scotia (Halifax and Sydney) is closed.

First Nations gaming establishments must close.

Video lottery terminals (VLTs) are not permitted to operate.

Liquor licensed (drinking) establishments (like bars, wineries, distillery tasting rooms and craft taprooms) are restricted to takeout, delivery and drive-thru service only.

# Take 2

When I was digging through my shelf of music DVDs I found this fantastic collection, THE BEATLES-"27 No.1's". The Beatles were ahead of their time musically and visually; the band saw the benefit of shooting promotional films, doing live TV performances and filming music videos as a way to connect with the millions of fans who'd never get the chance to see them live. This vision was even more astute when the band decided to stop touring to concentrate more on their musical experimentation.

The Beatles "1" record was originally released in 2000quickly becoming the fastest selling album of its time. It had 27 of the band's biggest singles-and this is basically the DVD version of that album, with videos masterfully restored, frame by frame, to perfectionalso presented in chronological order.

With a collection this big it's hard to mention all of the clips so I'll just touch on a few of them; early career hits such as "From Me To You", the incredible "I Wanna Hold Your Hand", "Can't Buy Me Love" and "She Loves You" are in their original black and white form, but the retouching gives them a look that far surpasses the original cuts. My favourite from that period (and its here) is the great song "We Can Work It Out"-the



final irony being that in the end the lads couldn't. Also, to see John Lennon strolling down the streets of London to meet up with George, Paul and Ringo as they make their way via horseback from the city to the country for a fancy tea on "Penny Lane" is magnificent. The band's hippy days are represented here with the amazingly psychedelic and breathtaking "Hello, Goodbye"this one is definitely a trip to watch. It's also no idle boast to say that "Hey Jude" is one of this collection's show-stopper songs. There's a new video for "Eight Days A Week" that features performance clips edited together from the "Beatles Live at Shea Stadium" film, with the song acting as a soundtrack because it wasn't performed live at the concert. Also included here are "Help", "Yesterday", "Yellow Submarine", "Get Back" and "Come Together" to name just a few more. The DVD closes with a bearded Paul McCartney singing "The Long and Winding Road" (the band's last 'official' single) which serves as a fitting close and poignant reminder of the fact that the band would break up in 1970.

#### Volunteer, volunteer boards and you, hopefully!

Have you ever wondered what a volunteer board does? There are many types and reasons for these boards to exist. Some are a requirement for a society or group to exist such as a charity, society or group which is registered with the Province of Nova Scotia. Some boards are long established while others are brand new. Some are prestigious, some are "resume builders", while others are hard slogging to serve the board and the intended client... regardless all of them take work to manage the personalities, problems and goals of the group or entity. This "entity" allows the group to apply for grants, fundraise and so forth under their registered name~ and require regular board meetings as part of their oversight. Sounds good in theory but most small groups are made up of folks that came together to solve a problem that came their way. Often times there are so few people involved that the group literally cannot fill all the "jobs" required for a board. [president, VP, executive director, chair, co-chair, secretary, book keeper, minute taker to name a few... not all are needed and some were left out, but you get the idea...]

**Reality:** most small group boards are made up of folks that recognized a problem and came together in an effort to solve that problem. Clifford Street Youth Centre is no different... we came together in an attempt to have impact on several community issues of the time... some of which continue, in one form or another, today while others evolved over time.

#### **BOARD MEMBERS NEEDED!**

Ideally a group's board should be made up of community members that share an interest in helping solve those community matters. Most groups require at least a time commitment but virtually all are on the hunt or need cash donations to survive~ we need folks to fundraise!! While the past Christmas our donations were way up, for the season, we have received no funding this year.... So the new board members ideally would have contacts, skills or ability to help resolve some of our cash flow issues. [Creativity is encouraged, grant writing skills an asset, community connections are helpful but truly just the desire to try makes all the difference!]

I, we, are looking for new board members to take up the torch and carry it into the future. Clifford Street is in its fourteenth year of operation and requires a fresh set of eyes, new ideas and especially bountiful energy as it goes forward. Ideally the board member [s] will be an active participant in identifying and solving issues. I, we, would prefer the candidates to not belong to multiple similar groups as this leads to conflict of interest/spying/confidentiality concerns. [yes this actually happens!] Those interested should possess some skill set, professional designation, proven experience, genuine interest, community reach, or simply want to volunteer "hands on" in solving those identified issues. Age does not matter, only commitment!

**CLIFFORD NEWS:** Currently the office is running as smoothly as it ever has in large, massive, part to Destiny Dermody who has taken up the reigns on a day -to - day basis. Destiny has things well in control!

We have just completed our participation in the "Kitchen's and Kids" program where the Wilfred Oram Centennial [ WOC ] library partnered with us to involve a number of area children, and parent/guardian, in a cooking program. This was a well

thought out program where the participants received, over four weeks, ingredients, spices and unusual sides, to create inspired and creative meals for their family. The first grocery order had all sorts of differing spices, flavors, and dry goods that will last long beyond the four - week program. The recipes were included each week with the delivered groceries.

HOW WELL THOUGHT OUT? - First WOC asked in the community about what they could do, differently, that would impact their clients. Then they applied for a grant. Then they engaged area community groups to see who would likely benefit. Then the community partner engaged with clients, guinea pigs lol, to see who wanted to participate. Then the first week's delivery, in this case by me and Clifford Street kids, contained a whole lot of mixed dry goods and the week's vegetarian creation, along with a lot of things that most of us would not, or could not due to cost, buy, a recipe sheet, a gift card to purchase some needed utensils, pot or pan, or whatever the recipient needed to complete their home kitchen upgrade. Then the culinary creating began! Each week, for four weeks, a special delivery of groceries was dropped off to clients. All were thankful for the creative and highly participatory program. The kids I spoke with really enjoyed the opportunity to cook and it was something different!

Well though out? Yes! Delivery was arranged to the client! Recipes were on line... but not all have internet, so a DVD was created along with a paper recipe sheet! What else? The gift card! Why? Because not every kitchen has more than one pot or one pan! Cooking utensil are expensive so not every kitchen has an array or them.... So the gift card was to help that along! Smart all around!!!

Last year we were lucky enough to be involved in the "Slow Cooked Dreams" program in partnership with Nadine Bernard and North Sydney Rotary. Here our kids learned menu planning, then purchase and create meals in a slow cooker... yet another stellar example of how to deliver a program! Each household got to keep the slow cooker!

These are but two examples of what we, and you if you volunteer, could do in your community. If you would like to volunteer with children, or Clifford Street, please do so!!!!!



of the last year 2020 in Belgium and Italy during their time there R o n n stated he recorded a




lot of music and he also films a movie the name of the movie is called Surprise Trip - a movie that Moss and a friend of his wrote and produced and he's also in the movie as well.

Liquor licensed (drinking) establishments (like bars, wineries, distillery tasting rooms and craft taprooms) and unlicensed establishments (like community centres, charities and organized clubs) are not permitted to host activities (like bingo, darts, cards, pool and bowling).

Restaurants are restricted to take-out, delivery and drive-thru service only.

NSLC can operate at 25% capacity.

Retail stores must close for in-person service unless the store provides services essential to the life, health or personal safety of individuals and animals. Essential service retail stores can operate at 25% capacity.

Wearing a non-medical mask is required for staff, visitors and children 2 or older when they're in indoor childcare settings.

Wearing a non-medical mask is required outdoors when a physical distance of 2 metres (6 feet) can't be consistently maintained, including playgrounds and parks

### TAX TIPS COLUMN

#### TOP SIX OVERLOOKED TAX DEDUCTIONS

- **1. MEDICAL EXPENSES -** Everything from routine dental visits to prescriptions to doctors' fees could earn you a credit.
- 2. Union/Professional Dues and Licensing Examination Fees

Most union dues are deducted directly from your paycheck and appear on your T4 (box 44). If you've paid any other amounts to a union or professional organization, be sure to keep the receipts for tax time.

- **3. MOVING EXPENSES -** If you've relocated for work, you may be eligible to claim a wide range of moving expenses for you and your family.
- **4. STUDENT LOAN INTEREST** Interest paid on a student loan is an often-overlooked credit.
- **5. CHILDCARE EXPENSES** Along with the usual fees from daycares or in-home providers, most overnight camps and summer day camps are also eligible for the deduction.
- **6. EMPLOYMENT EXPENSES -** From home office costs to tradesperson's tools, if you incur certain expenses related to your job, you may qualify for a deduction at tax time.
