



The Ghostly Piper

There's a popular Cape Breton song performed by Charlie MacKinnon called "The Ghost of Bras d'Or" and it tells the story of a piper who was killed in the war and returned home each night to pipe the sun down.

It reminds me of a story my father used to tell around the campfire at Gillis Lake about a Cape Breton piper who went into battle during World War 2 and carried his bagpipes with him into battle.

His nickname was Piper McCallum and many times as the battle raged he would be heard piping away on a nearby hilltop. He stood tall and in the open as he marched along playing the Scottish airs and jaunty tunes rallying his fellow soldiers.

He also played "Amazing Grace" and "Flowers Of The Forest" over the graves of his fallen comrades. He was at a battle in France in 1947 when he was wounded in the arm by a sniper.

He was mustered out and placed on a troop ship heading back to Canada. He said a tearful farewell to his comrades and that was the last they heard of them until the chaplain informed his fellow soliders that Piper had been torpedoed and killed as the ship made its way across the North Atlantic.

This news brought tears and sorrow to the platoon and they told stories of Piper's generous nature and his unfailing good humour.

About a month after his death, fierce fighting broke out and many casualties had left the troops downhearted and morale was rapidly going downhill.

Just as their Captain outlined the next push to take a hill, they all plainly heard a bagpipe in the distance playing the same Scottish tunes as Piper had done so many times.

At first it unnerved them but soon they came to realize that it was the Ghost of Piper McCallum coming to rally them in their time of need.

Over the next two years until the Armistice was signed, they were numerous mentions of a ghostly piper playing the Celtic tunes for the troops. Nobody ever saw him but they most certainly heard him.

Celtic history tells us about the fierce loyalty a soldier has to his clan and this story reinforces that loyalty.

Alan Rickman's character has the best line in the movie when he says to a spineless politician who just insulted him; "never tell a soldier that he does not know the cost of war". GRASS FIRE SAFETY

A grass fire differs from other fires by its extensive size, the speed at which it can spread out form its original source, its potential to change direction unexpect-



edly and its ability to jump gaps such as roads, rivers and fire breaks. To prevent dangerous grass fires, assess your property to determine its risk. Tall trees, wild grass, shrubs and any other combustible materials can all contribute to spreading a fire. During drought or extended lengths of dry weather, this vegetation can become perfect fuel for a fire driven by strong winds. Some simple planning will greatly reduce the threat to your home, property and community.

- * Do not throw cigarette or cigar butts on the ground or out of a vehicle. Dispose of them properly and make sure the are completely extinguished.
- * Keep a 30 foot "safety zone" surrounding your home. This area should be clear of brush, with grass cut short. Store firewood and other combustible materials at least 30 feet away from any buildings. For homes that sit on a steep slope, the safety zone should be increased accordingly.
- * Keep your yard healthy, cut and watered it is a natural firebreak.
- *Clean up dead leaves and twigs from yard, roof and gutters. Cut tree limbs within 15 feet of the ground and remove dead branches that extend over the roof.
- * Do not park cars, trucks or recreational vehicles on dry grass or shrubs. Exhaust systems on vehicles can reach temperatures of more than 500° C. It only takes about 200° C to start a grass fire in the Summer.
- * Use an approved spark arrester on all internal combustion engine power equipment. This special muffler helps ensure that sparks generated by off road vehicles, chainsaws and other equipment don't start grass fires.
- * Parents should emphasize to their children the dangers of playing with fire. Children who have no idea how quickly flames can grow and spread, start many grass fires.
- * Homeowners who barbecque should maintain a 10 foot area free of brush and shrubbery around grills and propane tanks. Never leave a grill unattended.
- * Keep a shovel, buckets of water, fire extinguisher or garden hose on hand any time while burning outside.
- * If conducting a controlled burn, have a water hose close by and inform your local fire department before burning.



TAX TIPS COLUMN

ARE YOU SELF EMPLOYED?

The COVID-19 pandemic is affecting everyone, including selfemployed individuals. The Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) understands you may have faced many challenges this past year, and we're focused on supporting you this tax season. To get ready for a tax filing season like no other, we've put together helpful tips and information for self-employed individuals.

Sign up for direct deposit and file online to reduce impacts and delays

Due to COVID-19, it may take the CRA 10 to 12 weeks to process paper returns. For this reason, the CRA encourages you to sign up for direct deposit and to file your income tax and benefit return online to get any refund for which you may be eligible faster and avoid delays.

Using the CRA's digital services is the fastest and easiest way to view and manage your tax and benefit information. The CRA also encourages you to sign up for My Account and My Business Account ahead of time, and gather all your information for filing your return. The CRA's Get Ready page has information on online filing, deadlines, and other helpful links.

The impact of COVID-19 benefits on your return - If you received the Canada Emergency Response Benefit (CERB), Canada Emergency Student Benefit (CESB), Canada Recovery Benefit (CRB), Canada Recovery Sickness Benefit (CRSB), or Canada Recovery Caregiving Benefit (CRCB) payments, these are considered taxable income, and you will have to enter the total of the amounts you received on your return. You will receive a T4A (for benefits issued by the CRA) and/or a T4E (for benefits issued by Service Canada) tax slip in the mail with the information you need for your return. You can view tax slips online as of February 8, 2021 in My Account. Residents of Quebec will receive both a T4A and RL-1 slip.

These benefit payments are not considered self-employment income. In addition, you may owe tax when filing your return. This will depend on your personal circumstances, and the type of COVID-19 benefits you received:

If you received the CERB or CESB, no tax was withheld when payments were issued, and you may owe tax when filing your 2020 tax return.

If you received the CRB, CRSB, or CRCB, 10% tax was withheld at source. However, this may not be all the tax you need to pay. When you complete your personal income tax return, you may need to pay more (or less), depending on how much income you earned in 2020.

Also, you may have received federal, provincial, or territorial government program assistance such as the Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy (CEWS), the Temporary 10% wage subsidy or the Canada Emergency Rent Subsidy (CERS). You are responsible for reporting the amount of assistance received through these programs when you file your income tax return.

Government assistance income is taxable and will either be included in business income or, if you elect, will reduce your business expenses. You may also have received a government loan. The loan itself is not taxable, however, any part of the loan that is forgivable is taxable in the year in which the loan is received.
