

However, the father of two also says, "for the first time in a long time, there is hope."


With Erin O'Toole you get Canada's Recovery Plan to get our county back on track. It shows real promise for Sydney-Victoria.

I'm sure some of you saw new audio cassettes on store shelves lately, and thought "what?" Audio cassettes first appeared in 1963-and 'unofficially' died out around 2001. Vinyl records never totally disappeared though, but were almost made extinct-and then saw a resurgence from the mainstream buyer, as opposed to the days when it was just audiophiles keeping the heartbeat of vinyl going. According to Rolling Stone magazine, in the United States vinyl sales are growing three times as fast as CD sales are declining, and will soon totally surpass CD sales. What originally made cassettes so popular was their portability, and the fact that they were recordable. The era of the mix tape had begun, the latest resurgence spawned by movies like "Guardians of the Galaxy" where that mixtape played a big role in the movie. The dawn of the compact disc almost rang the death knell for cassettes-offering a greater sound quality than cassettes could. The cassette was an improvement over the 8-track. but all that hissing couldn't hold a candle to CD quality. However, just like vinyl some musicians liked that warmer sound analog cassettes offered. For the most part the



cassette return is a marketing/ fan collectible thing, but sales in the states and Canada continue to grow year after year. At first most of those were again were because of the "Guardians of the Galaxy" soundtracks. The allure of that pocket-sized marvel comes down to a few reasons: for new releases it's nostalgia, where years ago it was the whole bootleg capability for bands and fans; tapes being cheap and easy to record-and pass around, especially from vinyl rips. Now it's people wanting to actually own something when they buy music, not like digital albums that really doesn't exist physically. I have a lot of experience using audio cassettes, both professionally and personally-and I still have numerous expensive machines for recording, but when CD's replaced cassettes it was a definite leap forward. However, I still have my cassettes that I bought years ago, and will always keep them. So let's press PLAY and enjoy the ride.


