SYDNEY-VICTORIA ELECTION RESULTS



Liberal incumbent Jaime Battiste, was successful in retaining his seat in the Sydney-Victoria riding

Battiste garnered 13,770 votes, making up 39 per cent of the vote, while PC candidate

Eddie Orrell came a close second with 12,646 votes and 36 per cent of the total votes

NDP's Jeff Ward received 6,962 votes, while Robert Barron of the People's Party of Canada came in with,173 votes, Green Party candidate Mark Embrett 431 votes and Nikki Boisvert of the Marxist-Leninist Party a disant fifth place with126 votes.

Elsewhere on the Island, Mike Kelloway retained his seat in the Cape Breton-Canso

riding.

In an Inverness oran newsaper report, Kelloway stated "I'm ready to work hard," Kelloway said last night, moments after being declared winner in the federal elec-



tion, narrowly besting Conservative candidate Alfie MacLeod by 1,619 votes or three percent of the 41,857 cast in the riding.

"I don't have all the answers, but what I do have is the focus – and I think the campaign has demonstrated that – hopefully my work ethic (and) the ability to listen, to bring people together, to look at key priorities for the riding," Kelloway said.

With 213 of 214 polls reporting, Kelloway carried the night with 17,348 votes, though early votes had Conservative competitor Fiona MacLeod trailing at one point by about 600 votes. Toward the end of the night, the gap between the two widened further, with MacLeod earning 13,133 votes.

Jana Reddick, representing the NDP, placed third with 5,395 votes, while People's Party of Canada candidate Brad Grandy finished fourth with 1,589 votes.



The mighty Maiden has returned! It's been 6 years since we heard new material from Bruce Dickinson and the boys so this is a real treatand it's a double album to boot, with amazing artwork inside. The second disc features great numbers as well; "Death Of The Celts" does indeed have a Celtic feel at times and "The Parchment" entices the listener to take a Homeric musical journey with the band, which can also be said about the song "Darkest Hour". The album closes with the atmospheric "Hell On Earth"-and as it began so shall it end-a heavy metal crusade of power and glory. Here's a true fact for va; Iron Maiden rented out Centre200 many moons ago to rehearse for their "Seventh Son" album tour. I got into the venue to see the huge iceberg stage; I didn't meet the band but spoke to the tour manager about why the band didn't do a concert here; he said that it wouldn't look good to concert promoters if the band opened a tour playing in front of only 5000 people (this was preinternet days) so they spent the week here rehearsing. 

But his next incident occurred at Gillis Lake one bright Summer evening. My father liked to fish trout and we had a 12 foot aluminum boat that he usually took out each night.


