Recently we had a power | outage and it messed up our server and we had to rebuild it from scratch.


While doing so, I realized that there were a lot of free items that you could download especially now that we are spending more time indoors.





What is 211? Helpline offers families support



(NC) We all know to dial 9-1-1 in an emergency. But now there's another three-digit number you can dial for help finding any kind of non-emergency support you might need. 211 is a free, confidential service that connects people to social and community supports available seven days a week.

Whether you're looking for seniors' programs, groups for new parents, after-school programs, counselling or mental health support, employment programs, food banks, housing help, legal information, or countless other topics -- the real person you speak to on the line can direct you to the best resources for your unique situation. They'll listen and ask questions to fully understand your situation, but you don't have to give your name or any personal details.

According to caller surveys completed in Ontario, over 95 per cent of callers would call again or recommend 211 to a friend or family member.

As part of its COVID-19 response, the Government of Canada provided funding to United Way Centraide Canada to expand the service nationwide.

Some provinces with existing service saw a dramatic rise in calls in the first wave of the pandemic, and many callers had never needed to access supports before. The shutdowns had presented them with new challenges, such as isolation, anxiety, and financial strain.

As information, programs and services changed rapidly, 211 navigators helped callers find the right support.



Regular readers to this space will know that I'm a big fan of books about bands rockumentaries if you will, so when I saw a book about The Clash I had to have it. I finished reading this book last week and honestly "Stealing All **Transmissions: A Secret** History of The Clash" is a bit of a misleading title. I was expecting what the full name advertised-instead I got what I can only describe as 160 pages of a slightly pompous and academic thesis on American radio and formats during the early punk rock days, with most of the book highlighting the antics and exploits of FM radio disc jockeys who handpicked what they played. Too many words were spent on describing the radio programming formats before, during and after punk rock radio fizzled off the airwaves in the major American cities during the late 1970's and up to the 1980's-when "corporate radio" gutted any semblance of originality on the airwaves (the same state of radio that we have) where the disc jockeys picked the music to play-and often times 'broke' new artists into the American music scene, such as The Clash, U2, and Ultravox. The book's Foreword was written by Clash roadie Barry "The Baker" Auguste, but in it he says how important this book is in chronicling the rise of the band in America-methinks he got some 'filthy lucre' for those



words. That's not to say that the book is all bad; there are some interesting insights into The Clash's early days, and how Joe Strummer realized that his former band The 101'ers were finished as an entity after seeing The Sex Pistols live for the first time. and how The Ramones made British punk bands amp things up almost overnight just to keep up. When The Clash signed a record deal with CBS records their U.K. Audiences pretty much turned their backs on the band, labeling them as 'sellouts' but America embraced the band even tighter, with Lester Bangs writing in New York's Village Voice that they were "the greatest Rock and Roll band left standing". In 1980 The Clash did a 3 week performance residency in New York, and it was described as a total take-over of the city, inspiring a legion of new musicians to push their own music forward. As for this book-it's not all bad, but I know there are more definitive books on The Clash out there just waiting to be claimed.

NORTH SYDNEY FIRE & RESCUE HEATING SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

There is something about the Winter months and curling up with a good book by the fireplace. But did you know that heating equipment is one of the leading causes of home fire deaths? With a few simple safety tips and precautions you can prevent most heating fires from happening.

Be warm and safe this Winter!

 Keep anything that can burn at least three-feet (one metre) away from heating equipment, like the furnace, fireplace, wood stove, or portable space heater.

- Have a three-foot (one metre) "kid-free zone" around open fires and space heaters.
- Never use your oven to heat your home.
- Have a qualified professional install stationary space heating equipment, water heaters or central heating equipment according to the local codes and manufacturer's instructions.
- · Have heating equipment and chimneys cleaned and inspected every year by a qualified professional.
- Remember to turn portable heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed.
- Always use the right kind of fuel, specified by the manufacturer, for fuel burning space heaters.

 Make sure the fireplace has a sturdy screen to stop sparks from flying into the room. Ashes should be cool before putting them in a metal container. Keep the container a safe distance away from your home.

• Test smoke alarms at least monthly.

HEATING EQUIPMENT SMARTS

Install wood burning stoves following the manufacturer's instructions or have a Section 1 professional do the installation.

All fuel burning equipment should be vented to the outside to avoid carbon monoxide (CO) poisioning.

Install and maintain CO alarms to avoid the risk of CO poisioning. If you

smell gas in your gas heater, do not light the

appliance. Leave the home immediately and call your local fire deptment or gas company.

TAX TIPS COLUMN

New Canada Training Credit

Starting in 2020, the CRA has created an education fund for all qualified Canadians and credit \$250 to this fund every year. This amount will keep accumulating in the fund for 20 years up to a maximum of \$5,000.

You can access this fund by enrolling in a post-secondary or vocational course from an eligible university or educational institute. When selecting the course, look at three things:

The course is covered under the Canada Training Credit: The tuition fee is above \$100; and

Your employer or any other government program doesn't reimburse you for the course.

When filing your 2020 tax returns, you can claim 50% of your tuition fees or \$250, whichever is lower, as training credit. This benefit is refundable, which means that the CRA will credit the remaining balance if your 2020 tax bill is below \$250.

To qualify:

• You are in the 26-65 age group and a resident of Canada

Your annual income is between \$10,000 and \$150,000

• You have filed your tax returns for the year you took the course.

If you gualify for the Canada Training Credit, you can claim this refundable credit. Even if you didn't claim this credit in 2020, you can claim it anytime before you turn 65 as the CRA will carry forward the credit every year.
