As I've said, Ned wasn't particularly athletically gifted so when the starter gun went off Ned surged forward but he started to slip and lose his footing. He grabbed at the nearest handhold which happened to be Nellie Pearson's butt. She retaliated with a slap that sent Ned swirling to the right. Again he grabbed for a handhold and it was the back of Sammy Dufour's swim trunks.

Down went Ned, down went Sammy's trunks. Cameras clicked, senior women hooted and Sammy turned a wonderful shade of red. By this time Ned was actually in the water still holding onto Sammy's trunks. Sammy ripped them out of his hand and put them back on. When Ned tried to stand he was paralyzed with the cold and several of the retuning Polar Bear members fell over him and ended up in a tangle of shivering bodies.

I thought my father was going to have a heart attack as he was laughing so hard. My mother had tears running down her face and Dorothy Muldoon, 96, her first time at the Polar Bear Dip remarked, "If I knew it was going to be this much fun, I'd have come a long time ago."

Uncle Ned never went back for the annual dip but we still have pictures and every once in awhile, I take them out of the album for a good laugh.

Did you buy any music in 2020? Not paying for a streaming service-but an actual physical copy of a song or album? If you bought a CD, a record, an audio cassette or a promotional 8-track tape (Nielsen Music Canada reported that more than 8500 cassettes were sold in 2020) you 'bought' and own that music. If you bought music through iTunes or other music providers-you did not 'buy' music-you bought 'access to' that music, and even if you downloaded it to your phone or an mp3 player you still only bought 'access'. The exception to that is if vou burnt that music to a CD. Since the dawn of the MP3 (in 1993) the music world witnessed technological leap of epic proportions; the MP3 offered a new and cheaper way for musicians to spread their music literally around the world, but it also made music so readily available that there was soon too much music. Mostly gone were the days of trips to a record store, or Woolco, Zellers, Walmart or joining Columbia House to get records and CD's-all soon replaced by free Napster and Kazaa downloads, and other newer sites offering money for nothing-beats for free. Music is now superdisposable, leading to a sad state of affairs as record



companies had to find new ways to recoup costs, and make profits. Many didn't, and went under. The dynamics of making money off music was changed forever, and worst of all a song can now get a number 1 spot on the charts just by internet hits, likes or drops, and never actually sell even a fraction of what lower charting artists sell. It wouldn't surprise me if someone recorded the sound of a toilet flushing, and got a posse to "like it" enough, and score airplay for the recording; chances of that happening are not that far from reality based on the Pop crap we hear on the radio. The light at the end of the tunnel is the fact that there has heen resurgence of people of all ages buying record players and vinyl for quite some time now, and some music fans never stopped buying music in one form or another. So, for 2021 support musicians-buy a song or two, and skip the Pop drivel songs that are here today-gone later today.
