you could time hauling up a trap."

"It's functional music right now," Power said. "Instead of lifting a rope all at the same time off a barge, we're trying to get through this pandemic together. And that is that is the function of this music right now."



Take 2 with PAUL POWER

A Friend's recent post on Facebook reminded me that it's been 5 years since David Bowie passed away, which brought this album to mind; it was released on January 8th of 2016 which was also David Bowie's 69th birthday. Two days later he died of liver cancer. He knew about the cancer a vear and a half earlier, choosing to keep the news secret. Studio producer Tony Visconti said that David wanted this album to be his 'swan song'-a parting gift for fans. It's no surprise then that a lot of the lyrics dealt with David's take on his own mortality. The album started off with the title track, a song that I can only describe as "eerie", but given the gravitas of the circumstances the song "Blackstar" seems appropriate. It's also worth noting that the Unicode for a black star symbol is U + 2605(May happens to be Bowie's former guitarist Mick Ronson's birthday) and a "black star lesion" often suggests the presence of cancer. This song is almost 10 minutes long-making it a hauntingly epic effort. The second track gave us more of our 1980's David Bowie back; "Tis A Pity She Was A Whore" rocks with an uptempo beat-but less than complimentary lyrics about the subject. I'm not going to examine every song here (there are 7)



choosing to concentrate on a few; the third song on the album is my favourite one of all; "Lazarus" is an intense, slow-moving dirge that's very self-reflective, deep and revealing-and the music video is morbidly intense, with visual references to David's past works. In my opinion this was David Bowie at his best. The album closes off with the song "I Can't Give Everything Away", and as fate would have it Tony Visconti also said that David was planning a post "Blackstar" album, by writing and doing demos of five songs in his final weeks-suggesting that David thought he had a few more months left. I really wasn't much into David Bowie's early works, aettina to know his music more for the 1980's stuff, and later songs. I always knew that David Bowie was an incredibly artistic musician, actor, painter and producer-with an amazing career that spanned over 50 years. David Bowie was the walking definition of a true renaissance man; the world is an emptier place without him.
