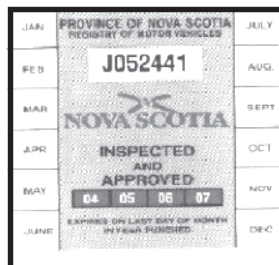

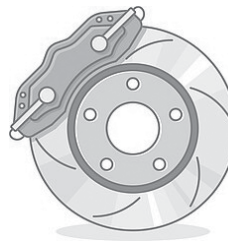

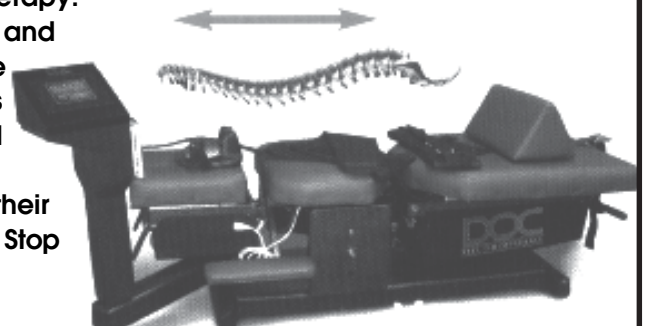

I first wrote about The Mahones way back in 1999 for the band's "The Hellfire Club Sessions", and then in 2010 for "The Black Irish" album; to this day they are 2 of my favourite Irish/Celtic Punk albums of all time. To recap, The Mahones were formed in 1990 in Kingston, Ontario by leader Fintan 'Finny' McConnell. Inspiration came after seeing The Pogues and The Clash live when he lived in London, England. Over the years the band's line-up changed, but the one constant is Finny's driving desire to put out great music. Welcome to "**Jameson Street**", an album designed to make you feel like yer out for a night on the town, which is what the first track (the album's namesake song) does in spades. Guinness and Jameson provides the fuel for the songs "A Devil In Every Bottle" and "Fiddle On Fire". As for some of the other tracks, "Freeway Toll" really reminds me of Joe Strummer's work and "She Comes For Love" has a real 1990's British folk-rock feel to it, imagine The Waterboys, if you will. On a



more sentimental note, the song "Holloway Jack" was written by the late Paddy Cuncanon (a close friend of the band) and is an amazing number. The unofficial closer, "Last Call At The Bar" is a great wind-down tune. As an extra treat a live cover of The Pogues "If I Should Fall From Grace With God" is included as a bonus track that actually closes off the album; this one is the craic for sure. This outing features a number of friends and colleagues who tagged along for the audio pub crawl; Dave Barton of The Peelers, Nicholas Smyth of The Dreadnoughts, Glenn Milchem of Blue Rodeo and Stuart Cameron of Crash Test Dummies, all joining Finny and his motley crew of musical gypsies for the musical merriment. With this album The Mahones have nailed it once again. You can follow the band on Facebook, Twitter and Instagram.
