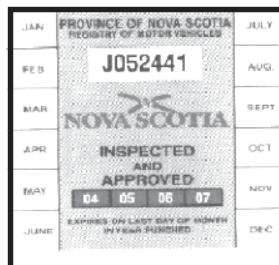

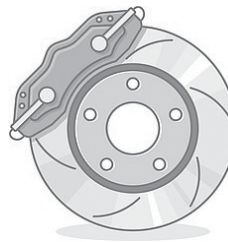

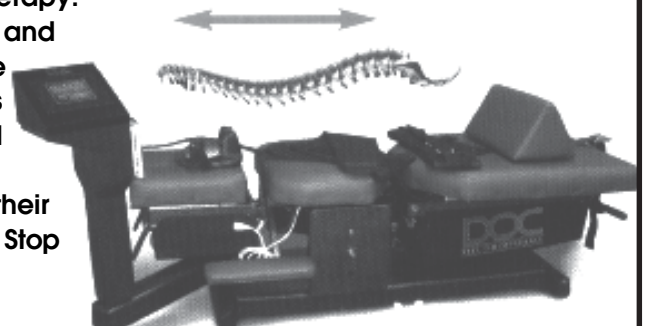

Let's call a spade a spade; Steven Page WAS the voice of the Barenaked Ladies. Of course Ed Robertson did a great job on some of the band's songs, but Page's voice was the one that immediately keyed the listener in to who they were hearing. In 2009 Page left the Barenaked Ladies, and has released 6 solo albums-including this one. To be honest I wasn't expecting to hear what I did on first listen; it's reported that 7 of the 11 tracks comprise a thematically linked song cycle that Page characterizes as "a suite of songs tied into what we've been involved with over the last ten years." **Excelsior** sounds like a concept album to me. The album opens up with "Feel", a song that "takes place at a funeral and deals with loss and grieving as a church choir plays inside the mourner's head" (oddly enough it sounds like a mashup of the Pet Shop Boys and Frankie Goes To Hollywood) while "What'll I Do Now" is an amazing song about learning to live with loss; it reminds me of a great Brit Pop number. Without describing every song here I will say that a real standout track is "Look To The Stars",



and "The Golden Age Of Doubling Down" is the closest Steven comes here to sounding like the old BNL days, and this one is another standout track that has an uptempo beat-but a dark message about being cruel. Page gets lyrically technical on "Zoom", saying "there's a point of view that we're supposed to believe that technology somehow makes our lives worse. During the pandemic Zoom did what it was supposed to do so you gotta hand it to them." The album closes out with the great "Something About Me", and as I listened to it I was reminded of Joe Jackson, Graham Parker and even Randy Newman. Amazingly, Page played most of the instruments here. This fall, the Steven Page Trio opened some concerts for The Who, so that's further validation of Steven Page's talent and this is a fantastic album.

## The Coal Bin Haunting

*A Ghostly Tale just in time for Halloween*

Many years ago, there were two apartment buildings on Davenport Road in Sydney and they were collectively known as the Hagel Block. There were many families living there in the two buildings and many of the fathers were Steel Plant workers. Coal was popular then for fuel as you could get a discount and many of the apartments sported coal bins outside their doors.

As the economy took its various ups and downs in the town, unemployed workers sometimes "borrowed" a bucket of coal from their neighbours to keep their families from freezing. This occurrence was often overlooked when the families were in need. However, there were times when some of the borrowing was due to not having money because of drinking. One such almost weekly offender was Todd Burman, an Englishman who had relatives and came over to work in the Steel Plant.

These "borrowings" would occur late at night and he never seemed to get caught. I often overheard grownups talking and saying they hoped one day he got caught and forced to "face the music." That was all we teenagers needed to hear. We decided to act as the local vigilante committee. The Steel Plant used to get paid on Wednesdays each week and the "borrowings" usually occurred on the weekend after Mr. Burman would have blown his pay cheque. We decided to set up a small speaker wired to an amp and microphone in the coal bin and scare Todd as he made his rounds. We fell asleep but just after midnight we heard Todd opening the coal bin lid. We turned on the mike and let out a yell and said, "This is the Coal Bin Ghost!" Todd flung his coal bucket about ten feet in the air and ran away screaming.

By this time, some of the neighbours turned on their lights and investigated the screaming. By now Todd was shaking and when asked what happened, he had to make up a story so that his true intent was not found out. He said he was walking home and he saw a ghost near one of the buildings and it frightened him. We teenagers had a great laugh over that one but from that day on, we never had to lock our coal bin because word went around that it was haunted.

**Hurricane FIONA** caused a lot of damage all around Cape Breton and here in the CBRM as well. Many homes and apartments suffered structural damage - one of those unfortunate renters was our friend and colleague **Robert O'Hearn** who was left without an apartment when the wind caused the roof of the building he was

living in to lift and extensive water damage was done to his living headquarters - the **Red Cross** offered immediate assistance with temporary accommodations at Membertou Civic Centre. He was then transferred to a motel in Sydney and was awaiting **seniors housing** and was told he was getting a seniors apartment in Sydney - he got a call from the Housing Authority rescinding that decision and was told he had a few days to **vacate the motel** and the only other place available was the **homeless shelter** in Sydney where he, a 78 year old senior with diabetes, would be housed overnight and put out on the street from 10 am until 5 pm before he could get back - with a few calls, Robert was **offered accommodation** in North Sydney and Whycocomagh but he has mobility issues and needed to be near a doctor and the Regional Hospital to attend to his medical issues - when news of Robert's plight hit the media, things changed for him - the Red Cross offered to house him until **January 3rd** to allow Robert and opportunity to find suitable accommodations - we'll keep you updated on his progress .....Robert's situation is **not unique** - many renters are finding it nearly impossible to find apartments in the CBRM due to the influx of international students - we need to build new **seniors housing** and **student housing** so that when storms, fires or other disasters leave Cape Bretoners homeless.... **FREE CLOTHING** for men, women and children plus Housewares at the Food Bank, 1 Cottage Street, Sydney Mines.... **CLOCKS go BACK** on Sunday, November 6 as Daylight Savings Time ends, it's a good time to change your **smoke detector** batteries as well .... we have a true story about a Ghost Haunting from the **Tall Tales** book.... 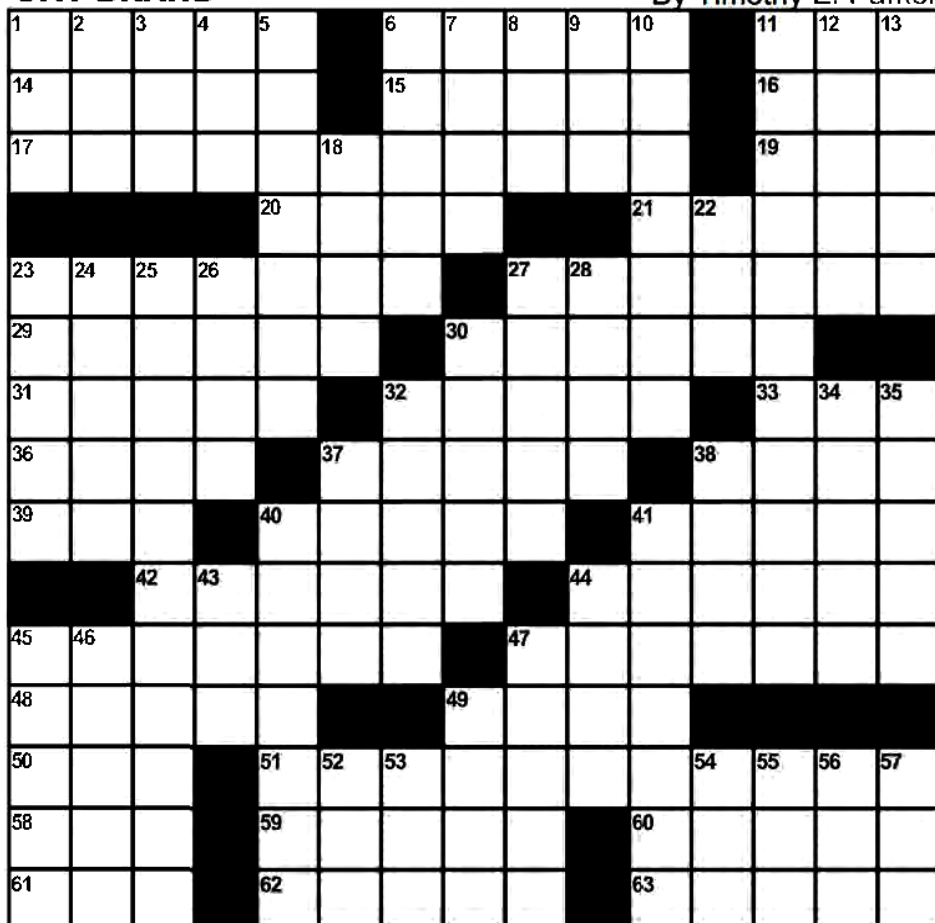
