

It's been 18 years since Tears For Fears (Roland Orzabal & Kurt Smith) released an album, so this one was welcomed with much anticipation. Of course the band saw it's biggest popularity in the 1980's with multiple platinum album sales, and major hit singles. After releasing 3 albums they had a nasty break up in 1991, with Orzabal keeping the TFF name. Even this album's recording process saw Smith walk away mid-stream, unhappy with what was being created. They regrouped and lucky for us stayed the course until completion of the album-thus we have **"The Tipping Point"**. The first song that was released was "The Tipping Point"-an atmospheric mid-tempo number highlighting Roland and Kurt's compelling and recognizable vocals. The songs that are the most like 'old school' TFF are "End of Night", "My Demons" (which I think is the best song here) and the truly magical and deep "No Small Thing". These songs really show us what TFF are all about-even after 40 years they are still amazing, mesmerizing and relevant. Numbers also worth mentioning are the uptempo "Break The Man" and the heartfelt and deeply moving "Please Be Happy"; Roland



Orzabal married Caroline Johnston in 1982. She developed alcohol-related dementia in the early 2010's, and Roland spent five years as her caretaker before her death in 2017. Orzabal wrote the song during his wife's illness. It was "inspired by watching someone you love sitting in a chair all day, not doing anything, not moving," as he told The Irish Times, "and when she does, she goes up the stairs with a glass of wine, and the glass crashes on the stairs." Curt does the vocals on the track and apparently when Roland first heard the vocals he had to leave the studio as the song, in his words "just demolished me". It's hard for a legacy band to match their first albums-especially when said albums became so popular world-wide, and it's easy to say they don't have it anymore. I prefer to be grateful that such bands are still here on Terra firma, giving us another chance to hear some more great music.

While I was there, I had a defibulator inserted into my chest and I was able to return home on Saturday, March 12th.

I would like to thank everyone involved for saving my life. Your decisive actions and medical skill were life savers.

I would like to thank all the personnel at the QE2, the doctors, technicians, nurses and support staff for all their welcomed attention as well as my immediate family for their support. It will be a little while, 6 - 8 weeks, before I can see you personally and thank you for all the good wishes, prayers, cards and emails. It was much appreciated.

TAX TIPS 2021

Here's what you should know about claiming your expenses if you worked from home due to COVID-19

What expenses can I claim? - Eligible expenses include long-distance calls you made for work, home Internet access fees, rent paid for your house or apartment, and utilities such as electricity and heat. The amount you paid for these expenses can be used to reduce the taxes you owe when you file your 2020 return.

For a complete list of eligible expenses, visit the CRA website.

Who can claim their expenses?

These methods are for employees who spent at least 50% of their hours working remotely during 4 consecutive weeks in 2020 because of COVID-19. This includes full-time and part-time hours.

You might still be able to claim your expenses if you went to your workplace, as long as you worked from home most of the time.

Keep in mind that vacation days, sick leave days, and other days off don't count towards the one-month period. The temporary flat rate method

By using the temporary flat rate method, you can make a claim without a signed form from your employer or receipts for your expenses. You can claim \$2 for each day you worked from home, up to a maximum of \$500. In other words, you can claim up to 250 days.

Did you share a workspace with someone else in your home? No problem! More than one person can claim the same workspace using the temporary flat rate method, and you won't need to divide the amount between you.

THE DETAILED METHOD - If you want to claim the amount you actually paid for your work-related expenses instead of a flat rate, you'll need to use the detailed method.
