As soon as I saw the trailer for this movie, "**The Unbearable Weight of Massive Talent**", I knew I definitely wanted to see it. The idea of Nicholas Cage playing Nicholas Cage is kind of mind-blowing, or is it? I've always had the impression that he plays a character that is a certain percentage of who he really is-sometimes a bit more and sometimes a bit less, but still Nicholas Kim Coppola (real name). The premise here is that Cage is having a bit of a career slump, and after losing a role that he wanted passionately he accepts an offer of one million dollars to appear at a birthday party for a billionaire's daughter. That billionaire is brilliantly played by Pedro Pascal (of "The Mandalorian" and "Game of Thrones") who, unbeknownst to Cage or his manager (played by Neil Patrick Harris), is a major arms dealer. The best part of this movie is, as expected, Cage being the most 'Cagiest of Cages' as well as Pascal playing an over-the-top character. Cage's ex-wife, portrayed by Irish actor Sharon Horgan, brings some wonderful lines filled with curses, and Ike Barinholtz and Tiffany Haddish as the CIA operatives also add levity and charm with their roles. Of course there are lots of



references to Cage's previous films, and one BIG fandom reveal-something best described as 'hero worship'. The website Rotten Tomatoes also said; "Smart, funny, and wildly creative," "The Unbearable Weight of Massive Talent" presents Nicolas Cage in peak gonzo form – and he's matched by Pedro Pascal's scene-stealing performance". Cage did actually say that this is a fictionalized version of himself who bears little resemblance to his real off-screen personality. Cage originally turned down the role three or four times but changed his mind after writer-director Tom Gormican wrote him a personal letter. I am willing to bet that after each day of filming Cage goes home and is the most chilled person you could imagine, because he gets to leave all of his angst, craziness and 'Caginess' on the screen, for us to enjoy. This is a good movie.

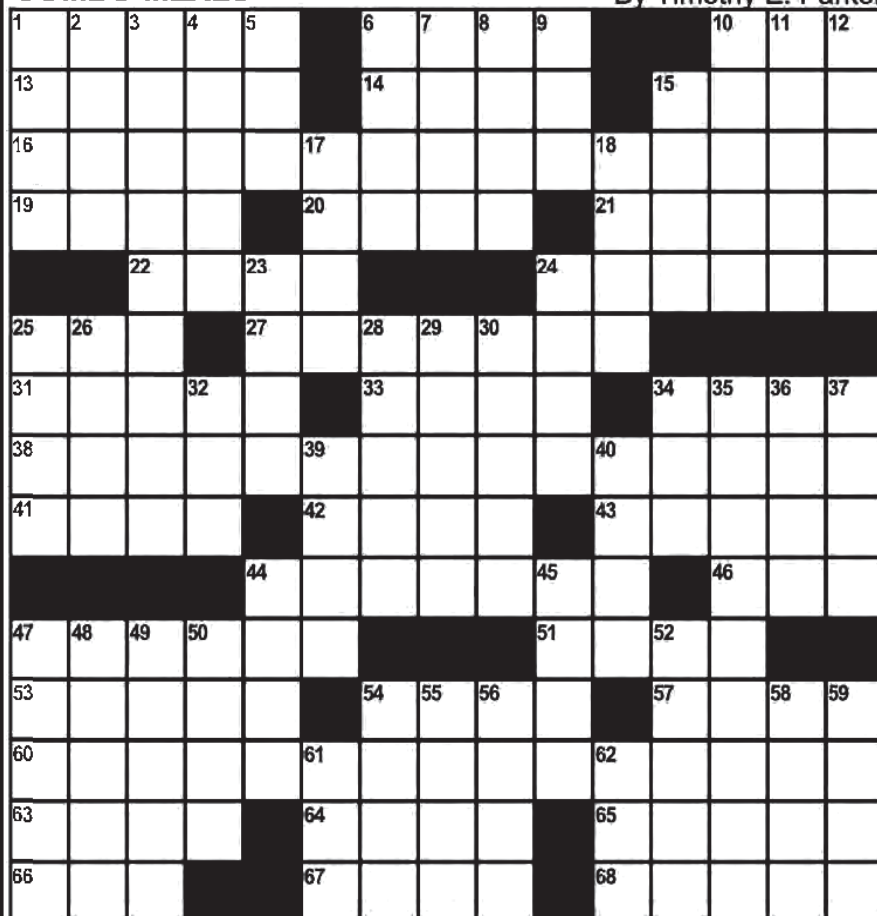

1929 Earthquake And Sunami Hits North Sydney and Cape Breton

On Nov 18, 1929 a strong earthquake shock was felt throughout the eastern seaboard, lasting upwards of a minute. The quake, originating on the southern edge of the Grand Banks, was the strongest in recorded history for the area, with a magnitude reading of 7.2. It was felt as far away as Montreal and New York City. The initial affects of the quake and aftershocks were seen as minimal, with Cape Breton Island reporting minor damage in the form of cracked chimneys, broken dishes and minor landslides impeding some roads, and no major injuries reported.

The same couldn't be said a few hours later. The people living in communities along the Burin Peninsula, Newfoundland were taken by surprise by a tsunami that destroyed and carried houses, boats and fishing gear into the sea. 27 people lost their lives in one of the biggest disasters in Newfoundland history.

The tsunami, estimated to have reached 13 metres, affected 40 communities in Newfoundland to a total loss of \$1 million 1929 dollars (estimated \$20+ million dollars today).

An eight foot wave came into Sydney Harbour, leaving significant damage in its wake, completely flooding Westmount Road and the shoreline road on the way to North Sydney.

In Main-A-Dieu the wave was reported to be three feet above the government wharf, where boats and debris along the shore were carried into the street. In Louisbourg wharves and fish houses were flooded by the first major wave and smaller waves that followed. Streets at the lower end of the harbour were seriously damaged by the enormous tide.

Although real tragedy occurred in Newfoundland, several people who lived through the earthquake and tsunami of 1929 in Cape Breton have passed stories down related to where they were on this eventful day.

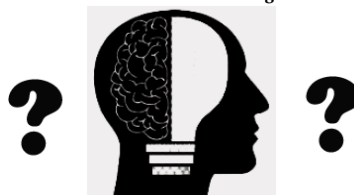
