





In the movie realm there are countless examples of hidden gems and treasures not yet discovered by most mainstream viewers. "A Sound of Thunder" is one such gem. I know some people who think it's weird to re-watch movies but since this film's release in 2005 I have watched it probably 5 times because I think it's one of the best adaptations of a Ray Bradbury story, and one heck of a good Science fiction tale. Granted the movie failed big time at the box office, recouping only about a third of it's cost, and critics were cruel-but what do they know-right? The story is set in the year 2055 with a corporation that sells an experience to rich "time tourists", who get to go back to a prehistoric time and kill a dinosaur (who was only moments away from dying of natural causes anyway) so as to not affect the timeline to the future, or 2055 to be precise. The unwritten rule in Las Vegas of "what happens in Vegas stays in Vegas" applies here too as nothing, not even a particle, can be brought back. That's where the chaos starts to unfold. It's the Chaos Theory and the Butterfly Effect all rolled up into one big cluster F. The film stars Edward Burns, Sir Ben Kingsley and Catherine McCormack and was coproduced by U.K., U.S.,



German and Czech Republic involvement-which might explain why this film has a somewhat unique look to it. The film was originally set to be shot in Montreal, with Pierce Brosnan in the lead role, but a rewrite request derailed it, and with the Hollywood writers and actors strike looming in 2001 that nixed those plans. Then Canadian producer Nicholas Claremont passed away, and Brosnan dropped out as well. The film did get done (obviously) but during postproduction Franchise Pictures went bankrupt, so last minute effects took a pay cut and the film barely got completed. Once again, I thoroughly enjoyed this movie for being just what it is-a great science fiction tale showing how greed and monetary gain can warp, twist and manipulate something which at first seems pure and noble, but turns into a literal Frankenstein's monster. Sounds familiar-and more relevant in today's world.

Waterfront Urban Market For Sydney

The Port of Sydney in Cape Breton hopes to have a "waterfront urban market" up and running in 2023, part of a \$7.5-million redevelopment.

The project includes changing Pittman Hall at the Joan Harriss Cruise Pavilion into a year-round market with retail shops and restaurants. The hall is one of the largest event venues in Sydney, but once the changeover happens it will no longer host large events like weddings.

"We have had plans for this for the last few years before COVID, but when COVID appeared we realized we aren't just going to rely on cruises," said Paul Carrigan, general manager of the Port of Sydney.

The number of cruise ship passengers visiting Sydney had grown significantly in recent years, but cruise ships were banned from operating in Canadian waters for well over a year under federal pandemic measures.

The port has started advertising that it's looking for businesses to fill the hall space. So far, Carrigan said there's been interest in setting up a deli and having an African restaurant. The organization is also looking for a variety of retail shops.

TAX TIPS 2021

COMMON MEDICAL EXPENSES

It's important to make sure your expense is eligible in your province or territory. The Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) does admit that its list isn't exhaustive.

To search a medical expense by name, or to see if you require a prescription, you can check out the CRA Medical Expense Chart.

Some common medical expenses can include:

Prescription medication and drugs, although this doesn't include over-the-counter medication.

Amounts charged by medical practitioners (although the types of medical practitioners that qualify will vary depending on your province or territory, so double check on the CRA website).

Bathroom aids (grab bars, grips, and rails).

Hearing aids - Hospital care.

Travel expenses to receive medical care outside your community if you travel more than 40 kilometres and the medical services are not available where you live.

Insulin, needles, syringes to treat diabetes.

Contact lenses, including equipment and materials for using contacts.

Private health insurance premiums for medical care coverage.

Medical Cannabis (the amounts paid for cannabis, cannabis oil, cannabis plant seeds, or cannabis products) if registered with a licensed supplier.

Service animal costs which can include including food and veterinarian care.

Ambulance service to or from a public or licensed private hospital.
