

Did you buy any music in 2022? Not a streaming service-but an actual physical copy of a song, or an album? If you bought a CD, a record, an audio cassette or a promotional 8-track tape you 'bought and own' it. If you bought music through Spotify, AppleMusic or other music providers you didn't 'buy' music-you bought 'access to' that music, and even if you downloaded it to your phone or an mp3 player you still only bought 'access'. The exception to that is if you burnt that music to a CD. Since the dawn of the MP3 (in 1993) the music world witnessed a technological leap of epic proportions; it offered a new and cheaper way for musicians to spread their music literally around the world-but it also made music so readily available that there was soon too much music. The days of trips to a record store, Woolco, Zellers, Walmart or joining Columbia House to get records and CD's were replaced by free downloads. and sites offering money for nothing-beats for free. Music is now super-disposable, leading to a sad state



of affairs as record companies had to find new ways to recoup costs, and make profits. Many didn't, and went under. Worst of all a song can now get a number 1 spot on the charts just by internet hits, likes and drops, and never actually sell even a fraction of what lower charting artists sell. It wouldn't surprise me if someone recorded the sound of a donkey farting and got enough people to "like it" to make it a hit; chances of that happening are not that far from reality, based on the Pop music crap we hear on the radio these days. The light at the end of the tunnel is the fact that there has been a resurgence in people of all ages buying record players and vinyl for quite some time now, and some music fans never stopped buying music in one form or another. One could say that they are music's saviors-and the MP3 is the Devil.

- TAX TIPS 2022 -

STUDENT TAX DEDUCTIONS

Remember to claim your federal tuition tax credit - The federal tuition tax credit is one of the top tax credits for post-secondary students. Even if you aren't reporting any income this year, you can use this credit to claim the eligible tuition fees (over \$100) you paid to take courses at your school. You can also claim fees you paid to an educational institution to take a course for developing or improving your skills in an occupation (if that institution is certified by Employment and Social Development Canada), as well as fees to take an occupational, trade, or professional exam, as long as you have the receipt.

The Canada training credit, is available if you paid eligible tuition or other fees for post-secondary courses you took during the year. In order to claim this credit, you have to be between 25 and 65, and have a Canada training limit. Your Canada training limit is based on the income reported on your return. The training limit for most Canadians who are eligible for this credit is now \$750 for 2022 which is up from its previous limit of \$500 in 2021. You can find your Canada training limit on your 2021 Notice of Assessment.

The Canada training credit is refundable, which means if your credit is higher than the amount of tax you owe, you get to keep the rest as a refund. This is different from the non-refundable tuition tax credit, which only reduces the amount of tax you owe.

Remember to claim the interest you paid on your student loans! Did you know the interest you've paid on your student loans can reduce the amount of tax you owe? You can claim the interest you paid in 2022 (or any of the past 5 years, if you haven't already claimed it) if your loan was issued to you under:

The Canada Student Loans Act;

The Canada Student Financial Assistance Act:

Act respecting financial assistance for education expenses (residents of Québec);

The Canada Apprentice Loan Act;

A similar provincial or territorial government law; or

A law of a province other than Québec governing the granting of financial assistance to post-secondary students (residents of Québec).

This means that interest paid on a personal loan or line of credit, a student loan that's been combined with another loan, or a student loan from another country won't qualify for this credit.

Old Time Radio And Music Podcasts

The Adventures of Ozzie and Harriet was a long-running American television series, airing on ABC from October 3, 1952 to September

3, 1966, starring the real life Nelson family. The series starred Ozzie Nelson and his wife, singer Harriet Nelson, and their young sons, David Nelson and Eric Nelson, better known as Ricky. The series attracted large audiences, although it was never a top-ten hit, it became synonymous with the 1950s ideal American family life. It is the longest-running "live-action" non-animated sitcom in US TV history.



When Red Skelton was drafted in March of 1944, Ozzie Nelson was prompted to create his own family situation comedy. The Adventures of Ozzie and Harriet launched on CBS on October 8, 1944, making a mid-season switch to NBC in 1949. The final years of the radio series were on ABC (the former NBC Blue Network) from October 14, 1949 to June 18, 1954. In total 402 radio episodes were produced. In an arrangement that amplified the growing pains of American broadcasting, as radio "grew up" into television, the Nelsons' deal with ABC gave the network the option to move their program to television.
