

In the world of rock and roll there's the age old debate of who was better; Dio vs Ozzy, Hagar vs Roth, etc. but in this case it is about vocalists but also brother vs brother on their solo careers-namely Noel Gallagher vs Liam Gallagher. I will say up front that I have always been more of a Liam Gallagher fan, but knew fully well that there would not be an Oasis without his brother Noel Gallagher-the mastermind of the band.

The brothers Gallagher are known for their legendary fights, eventually leading to the band's break-up in 2009.

They both released a number of solo albums and this is Noel's latest one; Noel Gallagher's High Flying Birds "Council Skies" and I was really looking forward to hearing the album after seeing the videos for "Easy Now" and "Council Skies" on YouTube. The main album has 10 songs, with an additional 14 bonus num-



bers-mainly consisting of dance mixes, live cuts, instrumentals and a John Lennon cover song.

The listener gets 5 songs into the album before hearing the songs mentioned above, where any hint of Oasis shows up and, unfortunately, a lot of the rest are kind of forgettable. It's not that they're no good-they're just kind of bland, especially in comparison to what brother Liam has released on his 3 solo albums. Admittedly "Pretty Boy" and "Love Is A Rich Man" are two of the better tunes from the bunch, and "We're Gonna Get There In The End" is definitely a song to remember, as it represents the best of Britpop; songs from the 1990's that reflected an influence by the Beatles. Being a big Pet Shop Boys fan I do like their remix of "Think Of A Number" here though. All in all, I applaud Noel Gallagher for releasing this album but I am still 100% team Liam.

TAX TIPS

To be eligible for the Canada caregiver amount, a family member must have relied on you for support because of an impairment in their mental or physical functions during the year. This means they needed your help with daily activities, such as cooking, getting to appointments, or bathing. It used to be a requirement that the relative lived with you, but this is no longer the case.

For the purposes of this tax credit, a dependant can be your or your spouse's:

Child or grandchild; or

Parent, grandparent, brother, sister, uncle, aunt, niece, or nephew (if they lived in Canada at any time during the year). If the CRA already has an approved disability tax certificate (T2201) on file for the person for whom you're claiming the amount, you won't need a doctor's note confirming their condition. You can also claim their unused disability tax credit

in addition to the Canada

caregiver amount.


