





CHRISTMAS TRADITIONS AROUND THE WORLD - Sweden - The Yule Goat has been a Swedish Christmas symbol dating back to ancient pagan festivals. According to the official website, the goat is more than 42 feet high, 23 feet wide, and weighs 3.6 tons. Each year, the massive goat is constructed in the same spot. Fans can even watch a livestream from the first Sunday of Advent until after the New Year when it's taken down.

The Christmas Tradition

Every family has its own unique Christmas traditions and they get passed on down from generation to generation. Whether it's going to midnight mass, trimming the tree, watching the Christmas daddies show on TV or going to the Santa Claus Paraade. Each family has its own way of ushering in the Christmas season.

In our family, besides the usual turkey dinner, tree trimming, cookie baking and carol singing, we would always invite Grannie Gray to join us on Christmas Eve and stay until "Old Christmas" or January 6th. We kids loved it because Grannie was a retired school teacher and she had "adventures" and stories galore to tell us. Long before there were computers or the internet, Grannie would collect and catalogue various sayings and word plays. We would all sit around during Christmas to listen to her "gems of wisdom." She would have them saved in various scrap books and we knew when she brought one out, we were in for a treat.

For example, "I don't suffer from insanity, I live in it daily," This one is a tongue in cheek look at human nature, "Beauty is in the eye of the beer holder." One she would often quote to me was, "It's better to be over the hill than under it." I guess she had a sense of humour as evidenced from these entries, "If you have to choose between two evils, take the one you haven't tried before."

Because she was a teacher, she often collected clever word plays. "A person who jumps off a bridge in Paris is in Seine." "A man's home is his castle, in a manor of speaking." One of my favorites that I clearly remember is, "She often broke into song....she could never find the key."

Newspaper headlines caught her eye for their apparent unintended meaning. "Teacher Strike Idle Kids, Red Tape Holds Up New Bridge, Kids Make Nutritious Snacks, Local High School Dropouts Cut In Half and Typhoon Rips Through Cemetery; Hundreds Dead."

Whenever it was too cold to go skating or toboganning, Grannie would play various games. She would never tire of cards, Parcheesi or checkers. But one of the best games we would play would be "Riddles". We children would ponder the various riddles that Grannie would ask us and it was years later before I understood that she would often be playing with us. Riddles such as, "OK, you know the speed of light, now what's the speed of dark?" Or this one, "What would happen if you got scared half to death twice?"

As an adult, I can now see the irony and sarcasm in many of the that Grannie had printed on her cards. Examples of that would be, "If you really look like your passport picture, you probably need the trip." "Don't worry too much dear what people think, they don't do it very often." One which I didn't understand at the time but now appreciate is, "No man was ever shot while doing the dishes."

It always seemed that Christmas season ended too soon and Grannie would go back "to the country" to her home. We kids would miss her terribly. She passed away at 94 but her spirit lives on in her grandchildren as we continue the tradition each Christmas.

I'll leave you now with a parting shot from Grannie, "How do you write zero in Roman Numerals?"
