

On May 25th of 1977 George Lucas unleashed an entertainment juggernaut (and that's putting it mildly) that opened the door to many galaxies, with characters that were inspirational, lovable, loathed and a few that are best forgotten (Hello Jar Jar Binks!). To capitalize on that phenomenal groundswell of popularity for all things Star Wars a year and a half later the "Star Wars Holiday Special" was released-and it was something that was weirder than any creature from the original movie. The special followed Chewbacca and Han Solo as they made their way to Chewie's home planet to celebrate Life Day (a Wookiee holiday) and featured all of the characters from "Star Wars", and introduced a new one-Bobba Fett. It was a variety special that had singing, dancing and skits but was so bad that it was never rebroadcast, or officially released on home video. It did soon reach cult status as a AI highly sought after bootleg VHS that became rarer than anything Indiana Jones ever searched for. Ironically,



the animated segment that introduced Boba Fett was well-received and in 2021 was released on Disney+. 

TAKE A SHINE TO

Cape Breton has a grand tradition of brewing drink and I'm not speaking about tea here. The Scots and Irish ancestors brought over their talents and skills of brewing and it has been carried on in every nook and cranny since that time.

Things were fine until the government decided to legislate the brewing of liquor and beer and it went underground. The government agents have spent time, money and effort in trying to uncover hidden stills. The locals have invented many plans and schemes to avoid being caught.

Some of the stories make amusing tales. In the early days of our island history, the stills were hidden in caves and distant places. Lookouts were posted and many traps were set to prevent discovery. As time went on, the stills were located close by hidden in plain site. One such example was a cow barn that had the still and copper pipes running together with the milking machines and to the casual observer, they looked like any dairy operation. Another ingenious still was uncovered in a restaurant that catered to the working man and the still was set up in plain site but looked just like a part of the kitchen equipment so any steam or heat was easily explained.

Once the "moonshine" was distilled, it had to be delivered. The drivers of the day were as experienced as any NASCAR driver would be today. I remember several of my kinfolk telling stories of being chased by government officials and the driver would turn up a particular road and there were traps set up like spiked rods and mud holes. The driver would know exactly where they were but the unsuspecting government drivers would run into these obstacles and blow out the tires on the cars or get stuck in a ditch.

The entire neighbourhood were generally aware of the locals and what they were up to. If any stranger or suspicious character showed up or hung around, they knew instantly and the village grapevine would report it. This story involves an actual case in the Inverness area. A stranger showed up in town and the "shiners" were tipped off.

They allowed the government agent to follow them to a farmhouse and in plain sight started loading gallon jugs in the back of the car. When they left the farmhouse, the government car followed close behind. To make it look authentic, the "shiners" began to speed and soon the chase was on. They roared through town and finally the car was stopped at a roadblock and the driver arrested. The "shine" was confiscated and the date set for the trial.

When the trial came, the defendant didn't even have a lawyer. The government official outlined his case, claiming he observed the transfer of the illegal booze and had it locked in the vault ever since. He took several jars to court to show as evidence. When he was finished testifying, it looked bad for the driver, Archie Neil Beaton.

Archie got up and said to the judge, "Your honor, I was coming home from my cousin's place when this big black car came right up behind me. I speeded up and he kept coming. I got frightened and took off. That's when I came to the roadblock." He then went over to the government desk, asked the clerk for a glass and poured a little of the liquid into the cup. He turned back to the judge and said, "Your honor, I am confident that you can tell good shine when you taste it." He handed the judge the glass and the judge took a little sip to wet his lips. He then downed the half glass as the court spectators gasped.

The judge turned to the government bench and said, "Gentlemen, this is nothing but pure water. You better come up with better evidence than this or your case will be gone like shit through a goose!"

The startled government "boys" opened the remaining jars only to discover there was water in all of them. Archie Neil knew he was being watched so he had filled the jugs with well water and the real shine was delivered after the government car started following Archie. They had been babysitting 20 gallons of well water for a month. The case was thrown out and the judge warned the government to have a better case the next time they came before him or he would rule in favor of the defendant. Archie Neil threw an impromptu party for all his friends.



TAX TIPS & VALUABLE DEDUCTIONS

ELIGIBLE CHARITABLE TAX DEDUCTIONS

Do all charities qualify for the charitable donations tax credit? - If an organization asks for a donation, you might want to check with the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) to ensure they are a registered charity. The CRA has an ongoing list of charities and associations that qualify. If you donate to an organization that's not recognized by the CRA, you won't be able to claim the donation. A registered charity will provide an official donation receipt, which includes their official registration number. The charitable donations tax credit can be claimed beyond just traditional charities. You can actually get a tax refund for donating to other types of organizations, such as:

Canadian amateur athletic associations

Registered journalism organizations

Some registered foreign charities (as long as the Government of Canada has previously made a gift to that charity)

Low-cost housing corporations for the aged

Municipal or public bodies performing a function of government in Canada

Municipalities

Universities outside Canada (but only if approved by the government)

What if a charity is no longer registered? - As long as the charity was registered at the time you made your donation and you have your receipt, you'll still receive your tax credit. The CRA's website shows if a charity was registered and when, so simply looking on their website will confirm for you if you can claim your tax credit.

Can all Canadians receive the charitable donations tax credit? - Yes, all Canadians can claim the charitable donations tax credit, as long as they have an official donation receipt. It's important to note that charities don't have to issue tax receipts for donations under \$20.

Do charities send the CRA my tax receipt? - The CRA won't have a list of the charitable contributions you've made throughout the year. It's on you to save those receipts so you can file them and get the charitable donation tax credit.

Make sure to keep a record of which ones you've claimed and which ones you haven't claimed so you don't double file.

How much can I write off on taxes for charitable donations? If you're looking for tax deductible donations, the sky is the limit when it comes to charity tax deductions. You can claim eligible amounts of gifts to a limit of 75% of your net income on your tax return. So, if your net income was \$55,000 this year, you could claim up to \$41,250.
