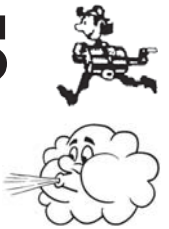

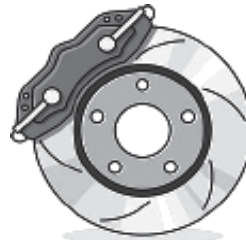

Seniors To Get Grocery Rebate

The Government of Canada has proposed to increase the Canada Groceries and Essentials Benefit (formerly the GST Credit) by 25% for five years starting in July 2026.

In addition, a one-time top-up payment equal to 50% of the 2025-26 value has also been proposed. The one-time payment would be paid in Spring, no later than June 2026.

This news comes as a welcome relief as we all know how much food prices have been creeping up in recent months here in Cape Breton.

Putting more money back in Canadians' pockets

The government is introducing the new Canada Groceries and Essentials Benefit – formerly the Goods and Services Tax (GST) Credit. We are increasing its amount by 25% for five years beginning in July 2026.

In addition to that, we are providing a one-time payment, equivalent to a 50% increase this year.

Combined, this means that a family of four will receive up to \$1,890 this year, and about \$1,400 a year for the next four years; and a single person will receive up to \$950 this year, and about \$700 a year for the next four years.

The new Canada Groceries and Essentials Benefit will provide additional, significant support for more than 12 million Canadians.

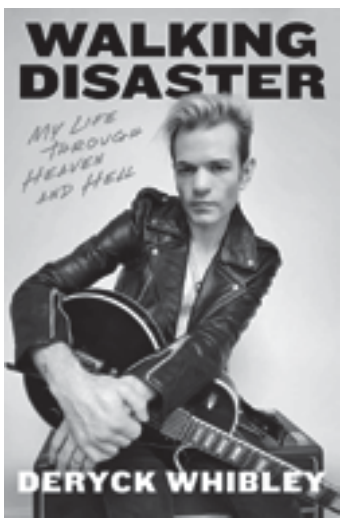

Recently I read a great book (thanks to the Cape Breton Regional Library; please support them in any way you can). It's from the lead singer/guitarist/songwriter Deryck Whibley of the band Sum 41. "Walking Disaster-My Life Through Heaven and Hell" is a detailed memoir of a self-described walking disaster. Deryck details his early life, raised in basically a single parent household in Scarborough, Ontario by a wonderful young mom whom he adored as a mom and his best friend. They moved a lot and that made things hard for Deryck to fit in and make new friends. Deryck was one of those kids who trouble always found; booze and drugs were the commonplace ways to have fun and sometimes escape the bad stuff. His slide into the punk rock scene was a natural progression as music was an important part of his life, eventually leading to meeting up with like-minded people and the rest is, well, rock music history. Fame soon followed and Sum 41 worked their asses off to find it; heck this guy from Scarborough, Ontario ended up dating Paris Hilton, marrying Avril Lavigne and leading



one of the most successful pop punk bands in North America. In the book Deryck alleged that the former manager of Sum 41 (Greig Nori of Treble Charger) psychologically and sexually abused him for several years-and had groomed him. Deryck mentions in detail the show his band did at The Savoy Theatre in January of 2001 and how after the show he was provoked by Greig and lost it-doing damage to the hotel room in Sydney and giving himself major cuts in the process. Oddly enough I did interviews with both Deryck and Greig that day (separately of course) as well as recording both band's performances that night. In May of 2014 Whibley almost died but after a long recovery period he went on to get sober, eventually marrying Ariana Cooper and having 2 kids. This is a great book.

THE VANISHING STOP SIGN

There are certain incidents that happen that change the course of a father/son relationship. This is a story about one of those times.

My father never had a drivers licence when I was growing up so we never had a car. I saved all my money from Christmas, birthdays, paper route and cutting grass and put into the Credit Union.

When I turned 16 I bought my first car, a 1957 Chevy with the money I saved. My father and I had planned a weekend fishing trip to Margaree that I was looking forward to going.

I drove my father to work at the Steel Plant and picked him up each day after work. On this one day as I was about to pick him up, I came to a stop sign on the Plant Road. I could see that there were no cars coming so I slowly drove through the stop sign.

As fate would have it, there was a police car that saw I hadn't come to a complete stop, pulled me over and issued me a ticket. In those days you had to pay a \$15.00 fine and lose your drivers licence for 1 week.

I was upset when I picked my father up and told him we had to cancel the fishing trip. He just said, "The law is the law" and left it at that.

Two days later I was in traffic court in the afternoon and I was surprised when my father showed up in his work clothes. When the judge read my name out, my father asked if he could speak and the judge allowed him.

He then said that he had just come from the Steel Plant and there was no stop sign at the intersection. The judge asked one of the motorcycle cops to check this out. He returned a short time later and told the judge that there was no stop sign there.

The judge said I was not guilty and free to go. I drove my father back to work and I checked and saw that indeed the stop sign was gone. Our fishing trip was on again!

It wasn't until a few years later that I learned that my father and several of his bowling buddies went down to the stop sign the night before I went to court and tore the stop sign out of the ground and carried it away in the back of a truck.

When I questioned my father about this, he once again said, "The law is the law."

- TAX TIPS 2026 -

We know what taxes we have to pay when filing a return but read on and see what items you DO NOT have to pay tax on.

GIFTED MONEY: No matter how big or small the amount is, money received as a gift isn't considered taxable regardless of whether it comes from a family member, friend, or another individual.

INHERITANCE: Cash or property that's inherited isn't considered taxable income. However, any income earned after you receive it (like interest or rental income) is taxable.

LIFE INSURANCE PAYOUTS: Most life insurance death benefits paid to beneficiaries are tax-free. This includes lump-sum payments received after the insured person passes away.

LOTTERY AND PRIZE WINNINGS: Money won from lotteries, game shows, radio contests, bingo, casinos, or most other prize winnings aren't taxable in Canada. However, if they were earned as a business activity, they would be.

CASINO WINNINGS FROM ABROAD: Canada doesn't tax winnings regardless of where they're won. However, many countries do tax gambling winnings for non-residents, and the casino or government can withhold taxes at source or require you to file a local tax return.

CHILD SUPPORT PAYMENTS: If you receive child support under an agreement or court order, payments aren't taxable to the recipient nor tax deductible for the payer.

PERSONAL INJURY OR WRONGFUL DEATH COMPENSATION: Money received through a court settlement or insurance claim or payout for personal injury, illness, or wrongful death are typically non-taxable.

WORKERS' COMPENSATION BENEFITS: If you receive payments due to a workplace injury or illness, these benefits are generally not taxable, though they may affect certain tax credits.

CERTAIN SCHOLARSHIPS, FELLOWSHIPS, AND BURSARIES: If you're a full-time student, most scholarships and bursaries are tax-free. Part-time students may need to report amounts above certain thresholds.

GST/HST CREDITS: This quarterly benefit, designed to help low- and modest-income Canadians offset sales taxes, aren't considered part of your taxable income.

CANADA CHILD BENEFIT (CCB): The CCB is a tax-free monthly payment to eligible families with children under 18, which doesn't increase your taxable income.

UNION STRIKE PAY: If you receive strike pay from a union, it's generally not taxable, provided it's meant to help cover living expenses and not tied to services rendered.
