Community Christmas Turkey Dinner





Hello, welcome to my first column of 2019. Question: did you buy music in 2018? I don't mean paying for a streaming service-actually purchasing a physical copy of a song or an album? If you bought a CD, a record, an audio cassette or promotional 8-track tape (Nielsen Music Canada reported approximately 8500 cassettes were sold in 2018) you 'bought' and own that music. If you bought music through iTunes or any other music provider-you did not 'buy' music-you bought 'access' to that music, and even if you downloaded it to your phone or an mp3 player you still only bought 'access'. The exception to that is if you burnt that music to a CD. Since the dawn of the MP3 (1993) the music world witnessed a technological leap of epic proportions; granted the MP3 offered a new and cheaper way for musicians and bands to spread their music literally around the world, but it also made music so readily available that there was soon too much music (no pun on the Canadian music channel). Gone were the days where if you wanted to buy music you had to go to a record store. Woolco, Zellers, Walmart or join Columbia House to get records and CD's-soon Kazaa downloads...and other sites offering money for nothing-beats for free. Music is now super-disposable (just listen to the latest pop drivel choking up the airwaves, like Cardi B, here today gone 10 minutes later) leading to a sad state of affairs as record companies had to find new ways to recoup costs, and make profits. Many didn't, and went under. The dynamics of making money off music was changed forever, and worst of all a song can now get a number 1 spot on the charts just by internet hits, likes or drops, and never actually sell even a fraction of what lower charting artists sold. 10, 12 or 15 million internet drops can make a hit. If you could get enough people to go along with it you could probably record the sound of a toilet flushing and score a top 10 chart spot-chances of that happening is not that far from reality, based on the current music zeitgeist. The light at the end of the tunnel is the fact that there has been a resurgence of people buying record players and vinyl for quite some time now, and some music fans never stopped buying music in one form or another. Dire Straits hit song "Money For Nothing" may have been prophetic (it was also the first music video to air on MTV Europe in 1987) but to quote Neil Young; "rock and roll will never die".


