

R.E.M. - "Man on the Moon" (Fontana North) R.E.M. released their fifteenth studio album in March of 2011; six months later they announced their breakup. The band started out in 1980 and quickly became the top band in alternative music. thanks to college radio airplay, fan support and constant touring. For a

career that spanned 30 years,

R.E.M. released some phenomenal albums and singles. Throughout those years the band's enigmatic yet charismatic lead singer Michael Stipe brought a raw -

and emotional intensity to the music and the live performances, breeding life into lyrics that were at times deeply personal, political and sometimes slightly obscure. Over the years the band was involved in social and political activism in a big way.

This DVD is of a concert taped in France in 2008 and offers some of the band's best songs performed live; "What's the Frequency Kenneth" and "Hollow Man" are treats for the eyes and ears and it almost goes without saying that "Losing My Religion" would be a high point at any R.E.M. concert. The

performance of "Until the Day is Done" is amazing here. "The Final Straw" is an intense Celtic-sounding protest song against the War in Iraq and the humorous "I'm Gonna DJ" rocks hard. complete with Blur-like "woo-hoo" harmonies.

There are 16 songs in total on the disc, with lots of tempo changes, making for a concert DVD that flows seamlessly and all too quickly. R.E.M. will be missed but thanks to this DVD some of their best musical moments will live on.

TAX TIPS FOR SINGLE PARENTS - Courtesy of H &R Block -

Eligible dependants: Single parents are allowed to claim the \$10,527 the amount for an eligible dependant (sometimes referred to as equivalent to spouse) for one of their children as well as the \$2,131 Child amount. You have to support your child in a dwelling which you live in and maintain.

Joint custody: If there are two children and the parents share joint custody, then each parent can claim the equivalent to spouse amount for one child. But if you pay child support, you cannot claim this credit.

Child Tax Amount: In primary custody situations, you are the only parent allowed to claim the child tax amount. For joint custody, then you have to agree to which parent will claim this credit. If you can't agree then no one will be able to claim it.

Child Tax Benefit: This benefit is calculated by your household income level so the amount you receive depends on your earnings. The rates and amounts vary by province but in general, if you earn more than \$41,544, the CTB amount will decrease until it goes to zero at around \$109,000. There is also a supplement for lower-income families earning between \$24,183 and \$41,544. In joint custody situations, the benefit is split.

Child Support: If your agreement is dated after May 1, 1997 then child support payments are neither taxable nor deductible although you do need to report them on your tax return.

Child Activities: The Children's Fitness Amount can be claimed by either parent but cannot exceed \$500 in total per child. Beginning in 2011, there is also a Children's Arts Amount of up to \$500 per child.

Universal Child Care Benefit: For any children under 6, you will receive \$100 per month under the Universal Child Care Benefit program but it is considered income. If you are single, the government now allows you to report this as income for one of your children.

Mary Royal's Cause is the 2012 recipient of CBRM's Gary McDonald Memorial Award, in recognition of an outstanding community project. Mary Royal's Cause is a fundraising and public awareness campaign of ALS, also known as Lou Gehrig's disease. The group coordinates a number of recreation activities to support the ongoing efforts of the ALS Society of Nova Scotia. Over the past three years, this small group of volunteers has raised more than \$14,000, with all proceeds going to the ALS Society of Nova Scotia.

Blair Boone from River Ryan is the 2012 recipient of CBRM's Anne Holland Memorial Award, in recognition of an outstanding community volunteer. Blair has been active in Ring 73 as an amateur boxer for over 30 years, and competed at the national level, winning a bronze medal. He served on the Ring 73 executive for 30 years, and as president for 25 years. Blair helped local boxers, who went on to win in provincial, national and international championships. Blair spent many hours planning and managing many provincial, national and international boxing championships in Glace Bay and Sydney, and served as a judge and amateur boxing referee for close to 30 years.

He helped with fundraising, including chairing Ring 73 Bingo for several years. Blair was the president of Boxing Nova Scotia, served on the Board of Directors for Boxing Canada, and represented the local boxing community at the provincial and national levels. Other volunteer activities for Blair include serving as president of the Cape Breton Miner Co-op, dragger man in mine rescue at Devco. He is currently vice-president of the New Waterford Fish and Game Association and remains a world class boxing referee and judge for Ring 73.

The 2012 Youth Volunteer Award co-recipients are Brittany Marsh from Millville and Mitchell Hanna from Howie Centre.

Youth Volunteer Award Co-recipient Brittany Marsh is from Millville, and is completing her first year of a Bachelor of Science degree from Mount Saint Vincent University. Brittany has served in several volunteer capacities in several organizations, including the Northside Hospital Foundation, North Sydney's Bartown Festival, Radio Telethon for the Cape Breton Cancer Centre, Ladies Auxiliary Hospital Gift Shop, and her residence committee at MSVU. His volunteer experience is varied, and he has volunteered for many local community organizations, most notably the Special Olympics, where he has coached basketball and soccer. He participates on many teams, including the Riverview Redmen, soccer, golf, cross-country running. Mitchell has coached softball for the Malcolm Girls team, and coached the Riverview Under 12 Boys Soccer. He has won many awards, including the Marty Chiasson Memorial Award for tremendous effort and spirited leadership, science fair awards, Lieutenant Governor's Award, bronze medal in Health Sciences at the Canada Wide Science Fair, plus local and regional awards.
